#### Dear Lonely But Loyal,

Of course I will get you a make-over! And I'll tell all my friends about this great opportunity. All-Sharp will be at the meeting on August 14 between 6:30 and 8:30, in the church parking lot, and will take scissors, clippers (except for horse clippers), knives, and garden tools for sharpening on a first-come, first served basis. Those with three or more items should wrap them in a towel and put them in a bag that is clearly marked with the owner's name and phone number. If there are too many items to be completed within the two-hour time period, owners of the items that weren't done will have the option of picking them up the next day at All-Sharp's Santa Barbara location. Prices for Fabric Shears range from \$7.00 to \$10.00, depending upon the size and condition.

## **ON THE PLUS SIDE** September 2014 | Block of the Month Coastal Quilters Guild

#### **FABRICS & CUTTING**

#### Plusses (A, B, C, D)

Use four **different colors** of fabric, in solids and small- to mediumscale prints. We recommend using at least one solid. Please make

sure to use colors from **across the spectrum**, rather than a single color family. If you make multiple blocks, try to use **different colors for each plus** to add variety to the final quilt.

#### From **each** fabric, cut: 6-1/2" x 2-1/2" rectangle - 1

2-1/2" squares - 2

#### Background (E)

Use provided Kona White. If making additional blocks, for consistency use Kona White only (readily available at quilt shops).


#### Cutting: 4-1/2" square - 1 4-1/2" x 2-1/2" rectangles - 4 2-1/2" squares - 4

#### CONSTRUCTION

Use 1/4" seam allowances.

- 1. Lay out pieces as illustrated.
- 2. Join an A square to a C square and join a B square to a D square.
- 3. Attach the A/C and B/D units to white background (E) pieces to construct the center row.
- 4. Following the diagram, construct the top two and bottom two rows. Join top two rows together and join bottom two rows together.
- 5. Sew resulting top section to center row and then sew resulting bottom section to center row.
- 6. Block will measure 12-1/2" square.
