"A Painter's Path to Quilting"

Workshop October 10: Painting on Fabrics with Inks

SWEET SIXTEEN PATCH

November 2014 | Block of the Month

FABRICS & CUTTING


Kona solid white - provided

Scraps - mixture of 8 different bright prints and solids.

NOTE: Do not coordinate scraps by color. The scrappier and the more variety, the better!

From **white** fabric, cut 3-1/2" squares (8)

From **bright scraps**, cut 3-1/2" squares (8 different)



CONSTRUCTION

Use 1/4" seam allowances.

Press seams toward the colored fabrics to prevent shadowing through the white squares.

1. Assemble block as indicated.
2. Block needs to measure 12-1/2" square.
