January 14

Sandra Bruce "Material Matrix & The Paths Taken"

This is a presentation using images and quilts to show Sandra's background, work, and an over-

view of her process called "Material Matrix, and how it all comes together using color, design, composition, and serendipity.

Friday January 15 Material Matrix - Sew Ready

This is a six-hour class where students use a provided photo to experience and learn the "Material Matrix" process. Some of the points covered



are: choosing the right photo, how to interpret a photo using a grid, value and color, curved piecing, using a mix of prints and solids, and ideas about quilting your project. The goal is to have each student leave the class confident enough to finish the quilt (approximately 18" x 20") and go on to do more complicated images.

Community Quilts - Hip-Hip Hurray!

We have exceeded our goal of 75 quilts magnificently! On the Monday before Thanksgiving, we delivered 93 veterans' quilts to Visiting Nurse and Hospice Care. According to my calculator, that's 125% of our goal!! We also delivered nine Hospice quilts for non-veteran patients.

On the Tuesday before Thanksgiving, we delivered 100 Christmas stockings to CALM. We exceeded that goal, too, by 39 stockings - 139%!

And I am already receiving pillowcases, about 50 so far, for December delivery.

These three projects represent an enormous amount of work by our membership - YOU, I'm talking about! They also represent an enormous number of lives touched and made happier - more than we can know unless someone tells us. We have received a thank-you note from the daughter of a veteran, telling us what that quilt meant to her father and her family. Look for it below, read it and take it to heart. Our work is important, and I thank you from the bottom of my heart for participating.

Here's where we stand now:

- Visiting Nurse and Hospice Care: We will continue to accept your donations of veterans' and non-veterans' Hospice quilts; these we will save for our display at the quilt show before delivering in the fall.
- American Charities Foundation will receive the 39 Christmas stockings. If you haven't finished yours or want to make more, bring them to the December meeting. These will benefit our foster children of Santa Barbara County. All of the pillowcases, also due at the December meeting, will go to foster children.
- Sarah House: We delivered one quilt, an Education quilt from the quilt show, to auction for their fundraiser. They have requested 8 lap quilts for their residents, who are very low income seniors at the end of their lives. We have three so far for Sarah House.
- CALM has requested 100 children's quilts, our next big project. We will have kits available at the January meeting. But you can start anytime! We already have three kids' quilts. Along with quilts, we will happily accept your donations of juvenile fabrics; we've used nearly all we have in the quilt and pillowcase kits.

The second pick-up location will be St. Andrew's Presbyterian Church, 4575 Auhay Drive at 7:15am.

The third pick-up will be at IHOP parking lot near the Union Bank, 1114 Casitas Pass Road in Carpinteria at 7:50am.

We will arrive at the show 10-10:15am. We will depart from the show at 4pm, and back home, with drop offs 6:15-6:45pm.

2016 Challenge - Games People Play!

For next year's Challenge, we are asking you to make a quilt inspired by games. But it can be absolutely any game you like, for example:

- board games (Monopoly, Scrabble, Shutes and Ladders, or Chess)
- card games (blackjack, hearts, solitaire or bridge)
- video or arcade games (Pacman, Super Mario or Candy Crush)
- sports (American football, soccer or basketball)
- even mind games...

There are a lot of places to go with this one, and you can be as literal (or not!) as you like!

In a change from previous years, we are setting a specific size requirement.

All quilts entered must measure 24 inches square.

Apart from that, there are very few rules:

- Only 1 entry per member
- Each entry must be labeled
- It must have a 2" 4" hanging sleeve
- Each entry must be submitted in a labeled pillowcase and accompanied by a completed entry form (these will be available nearer the time)

The Challenge quilts will be presented at the May guild meeting, and therefore entries will be collected at the April meeting.



Amazon purchases can benefit the Guild

The holidays are approaching and we want to remind you that IF you use Amazon for any of your purchases, the Guild can benefit – through either of two programs that Amazon offers:

The first is the Amazon program that we have been suggesting for several years: Amazon Associates. By going to the Guild's website (www.coastalquilters.org) and clicking on the Amazon link in the left column,

you will be linked to our account and your purchases* can earn up to 15% for the Guild! It's as simple as that! If you don't want to bother going through the Guild's website EVERY time you shop Amazon, go to our website the FIRST time and create a link that you save to your favorites (also known as Bookmarks)... that way you will never forget and your purchases will automatically be considered! REMEMBER: You MUST make your purchases through the Guild's website link for your qualifying purchases to count. If you are not sure if you are linked, look for the Guild's code (i.e. coastalquil07-20) as part of the web address. It will look something like:

The second program is called Amazon Smile and brings the Guild approximately 0.5% (that is one-half a percent) from most of your purchases*. From our survey results we know that many of you already access Amazon Smile with the proceeds going to religious organizations, the Food Bank, Direct Relief, elementary schools and many other organizations in Santa Barbara and we are glad you have made the connection for those groups and encourage you to continue. If you have not signed up for Amazon Smile and want to, go to smile. amazon.com, enter your information and select your non-profit (hopefully the Coastal Quilters Guild Inc. - Santa Barbara County). You can then create a link to smile.amazon.com - you can also add an icon on the toolbar on your browser - because like the Associates Program above, you have to go through the *smile* link for the purchase to qualify. Unlike the Associates Program, when you are signed on to the Smile Program, it tells you in the left side of the Amazon header. The logo will say amazonsmile and you should see the following:

Supporting: Coastal Quilters Guild Inc.

If you have links to both programs, you might want to rename your links - such as Amazon-Associates and Amazon-Smile. You can have both - you just have to know which non-profit you have assigned to which program. Note that we are not promoting Amazon but if you are not using either program and do buy from Amazon, we hope you will use the Associates Program as we receive more from that one.

Block of the Month by: The Blockheads, a CQG satellite group

January Block of the Month: "Folk Art Doodle Hearts," by Leslie Hogan

Awhile back, while exploring Pinterest, I ran across an image of tissue paper hearts, all shapes and sizes, glued every which way over a background of black and white doodling. It later occurred to me that this would make a great quilt.

Finished block size: 6-1/2" square

Techniques:

Machine or hand piecing Machine-finished appliqué

Materials:

Black and white print fabrics for the background Bright colored scraps for the hearts Black thread for the zig-zag stitching Fusible web, if that's your chosen appliqué method



Concept:

Free-style hearts appliquéd on a black and white background The number, size, and placement of the hearts is left to the individual.

Directions:

Using black and white fabrics, make a block of your choice measuring 6-1/2" on each side. The pieced blocks are to be a background, so simple patterns such as four-patch, nine-patch, crazy-patch, and half-square triangles will work well. You can even use a single piece of background fabric.

Next, choose the fabrics for the hearts. Since the hearts will be appliqued to the blocks, the color needs to be bright enough to pop off the background. Although some prints will work, most of the fabrics should "read" solid.

Cut the hearts out freehand, then appliqué one or more hearts on each background, using the technique of your choice. However many hearts you use, do make sure you leave enough room around the edges of the background block for the seam allowance. Finish each heart's edge with black zig-zag machine stitching.

And that's it. In the sample, there are two blocks with just a single piece of background fabric, two half-square triangles, a crazy-patch block, and four sixteen-patch blocks. I put them together without sashing, so you can see the effect of the fabric mix and the block mix, but you could choose to separate them with sashing or with alternate blocks.

If you look closely at the sample, you can also see that there are multiple shades of black and multiple shades of white, so don't get too fussed about the purity of the colors.
