Community Quilts News

The Community Quilts Committee is pleased to report that last month seventeen completed quilts were turned in for donation. Thanks to several devoted members, we continue to have surprisingly high numbers of quilts turned in each month.

CALM is especially needing infant quilts for their mother-and-baby parenting class. Whether in bright colors or pastels, in cuddly flannel or standard quilting cotton, baby quilts suitable for CALM's parenting classes should measure approximately 40" to 45" on a side. Make these small quilts from your stash, or check out a kit. Baby quilt kits have been very popular, but we still have some left, including easy panel quilts. If you are interested in making a baby quilt from a kit, contact Carol Barringer (info in the directory). Because of the Challenge next month, the Community Quilts table will not be available. We will, however, accept incoming quilts and donations in the entry area near the library.

April's Sew-In for Community Quilts was a great success and very productive, with about 20 people present for some part of the day. The food, donated by Trader Joe's, was quite a treat. The TV camera recorded as an assembly-line produced more than 150 pillows for doll cradle kits. Zippers were removed from donated duvet covers, making the resultant backing fabric easier to store. Cutting, sewing, pressing and layering... food and laughter with old friends and new... what could be more fun?

Coming soon: Doll Cradle Quilts for Unity Shoppe! Every year, the wood shop at Santa Barbara City College produces 168 doll cradles, along with an array of other wooden toys. The cradles are painted by local artists, and we make the bedding: mattress and pillow, pillow-case and quilt. Together, they make a Christmas gift for a low-income child. The quilts with their coordinating bedding are simply adorable, and very easy to make. Complete instructions can be found on the "Community" page of our website. Kits will be ready soon, but don't wait! Turn your scraps into doll cradle quilts! They should measure 16" to 18" square.



Workshop: Friday June 10 The Cushy Tushy: A Modern Toteable Box Cushion

When you go to sew outside your home, You often find chairs that were made for a gnome. Too low, too hard, they make stitching a chore, And your backside feels like you sat on the floor.

The answer, My Friends, And I don't mean to be pushy, Is obviously this --You need a Cushy Tushy!

Three inches of foam for our sitting pleasure, And three inches of height — what a treasure! Your cushion will look like it was made by a pro, And could there be a nicer gift for your friends who sew?







Learn the secrets of professional upholsterers and make your own modern box cushion. This is not your ordinary cushion. It's firm yet lush to provide proper support for hours of free motion quilting. It comes with its own shoulder strap so you can tote it to the next class, meeting, or game. This is the best-looking cushion I have ever seen and the comfiest one I have ever sat on. Cont. page 5

Check it out at the next Guild meeting! Looking at the Supply List (www.coastalquilters.org, under Programs tab), I see that there is the "H" word all busy people love to see - Homework. All you need to do for this is put together two 16-1/2" quilt sandwich squares. The top can be wholecloth or pieced, using orphan blocks or any pattern you like. Then stick them into your machine and practice your machine quilting – or not, if you prefer your cushion unquilted. The back can be fabric you want to use up, as no one will see it. Voila! Homework accomplished. The rest of the supply list is easy-peasy – Roxanne's has kindly ordered the exact zipper we need in a variety of colors, and Claudia says it's okay if we don't have or wish to buy the bulky overlock foot – we can share machines that have it to do that step.

There is a \$29.00 kit fee. This includes professional grade foam, upholstery batting, and cording, which will no doubt make our projects look better and last longer.

I expect to learn some techniques that I will be able to apply to future projects, like pillows, other types of cushions, and maybe even some DIY upholstery. Where there is piping, there is pretty!


BLOCK OF THE MONTH: A SNOWBALL'S CHANCE IN JUNE 2016

This is another easy block, and because it's so small and quick to make, you'll need four for each entry. It doesn't matter whether you use one or more solid white or white-on-white fabrics for the snowballs--no dirty snow (cream or beige), please--but all the corner fabrics should be different. In an ideal world, if you made a second or third set you would use sixteen new fabrics each time, but that might not be possible. Just don't use the same fabrics in the same combinations.

For each set, cut four 6" squares of the background fabric(s) and sixteen 2" squares for the corner blocks. Fold the small squares in half diagonally and press them well: this will give you your sewing line. Then open the squares out and place them in the corners of the background blocks as shown. Sew each square to the background fabric along the pressing.

To make life easier and to save thread, consider chain piecing the blocks rather than doing one block at a time. Sew all the upper right-hand corners, then all the lower rights, etc., until you run out of squares.

Once you have all the little squares sewn onto the big ones, press the inside points back to the corners (see below) and



"But she left out the part about trimming," you say. You are wondering why I didn't mention removing the undersides of the corner triangles, and possibly the background fabric too, ¼" from the seam line. No, I didn't forget. **DO NOT TRIM THE CORNER BLOCKS!** Some experts advocate never trimming the corners; some say it's optional; some piecers will want to sew a second seam ½" from the original, trim between the two seams, and thus acquire a lot of teensy triangles for another project. I'm leaving the decision up to the winner.
