Coming in August: The Joyful Quilter

Our August speaker is Pamela Dransfeldt; who has turned a lifelong enthusiasm for quilting into a successful home business. Pamela started quilting in 1977 and began entertaining thoughts of machine quilting in 1999 before purchasing her first machine in 2000. It filled what used to be her family's living room and dining room! She started her business with a small, but loyal customer base all the while continuing to work part-time in a hospital billing office. Pamela continued along this path for seven vears before retiring and focusing fully on machine quilting in 2007. Pamela maintains a busy schedule

that keeps quilts lining her machine, while still providing quality and time her customers deserve. Pamela regularly takes classes to continue learning and improving her quilting skills. She is able to provide customers with a variety of quilting options, from edge to edge pantographs to detailed custom work.

Pamela also makes her own quilts and collects vintage quilts. Pamela seeks out signature quilts or quilts with open spaces that she can fill in. She says, "I love quilting and love sharing quilting with others!"

Thanks to our members, we've had a steady influx of quilts each month and now we have more quilts on hand than we can store – so it's Delivery Time again! We have thirty-three children's quilts for CALM, fourteen quilts for Hospice and three for Veterans in Hospice Care. In addition, we've held back eight quilts for the Quilt Show. By the time you read this, these quilts will already be bringing joy and comfort to the lives of fifty people!

We also have five lap quilts set aside for Sarah House, which is a residence for very low income elderly people who would otherwise be homeless. They requested eight lap quilts, and since their request is so small, we hope for more. Many of you have also been very busy with Cradle Quilts and bedding sets – we have fifty completed sets already, before the kits even became available! And they are so very adorable – so many little girls will be thrilled to receive these for Christmas gifts!

We do have kits ready to roll and many were signed out last month. Unfortunately, with the tables set up for a bountiful potluck picnic at the July meeting, there is not space for a regular Community Quilts table; we will have a spot to accept your finished quilts and donations of fabric, but we will not have

Take the Plunge!

The judging committee encourages you to submit your quilt(s) to be judged in the Harvest of Colors Quilt Show in September. We think it is a great opportunity to receive an unbiased written critique of your work. The judge will give you several positive comments as well as one or two suggestions for improvement. Please know your critique is confidential and is a positive experience!

You can find the judging forms on our web site. There will be a form to enter the show and a separate form for judging. There is a \$10.00 fee for judging and you will need to attach a photo to the judging form. There is a limit of two quilts per person to be judged and a limit of 85 quilts for judging altogether. Quilt Categories and their descriptions will be listed on the judging forms. kits available to sign out. However, if you are anxious to get started on your cradle sets, you can call or email Carol Barringer to make arrangements to meet. In August we'll really get things rolling; the deadline for cradle sets is the October 13 meeting.



Framed 4-Patch 12" Block

August 2016 Coastal Quilters Guild Block of the Month



August at the Farmer's Market is just wonderful! All the fruits and veggies look so yummy! Choose a fruit or vegetable print and a leafy green print to stitch up this one.


Cutting *White solid or white on white print:* Cut 4 (3-1/2") squares.

Medium green print: Cut 4 (3-1/2") squares.


Any fruit or vegetable print: strawberries, melons, tomatoes, mushrooms, oranges, etc. Cut 4 $(3-1/2 \times 6-1/2")$ rectangles.


Assembly

1. Sew center 4 squares together. Press to green squares. Sew center unit to rectangles. Press to rectangles.



2. Sew squares to rectangles. Press to rectangles. Join units to make the block. Block should measure 12-1/2".
