




The Joyful Quilter

Pamela continued along this path for seven years before retiring and focusing fully on machine quilting in 2007. Pamela maintains a busy schedule

that keeps quilts lining her machine, while still providing quality and time her customers deserve. Pamela regularly takes classes to continue learning and improving her quilting skills. She is able to provide customers with a variety of quilting options, from edge to edge pantographs to detailed custom work.

Pamela also makes her own quilts and collects vintage quilts. Pamela seeks out signature quilts or quilts with open spaces that she can fill in. She says, "I love quilting and love sharing quilting with others!"

"I've always been afraid of losing people I love, but sometimes I ask myself, is there anyone who is afraid of losing me too?"




Get Ready to Reap our Harvest of Colors

I cannot stress enough how important it is for you to spread the word about the show to your family, friends, neighbors and co-workers. Not only is this an opportunity to showcase our talent but it is the single largest fundraiser we have for the guild to support our ongoing programs. 


Welcome a Winner!

Now It's Time for "Cradle Quilts"

Now you've got your Quilt Show entries in and it's time for a "little" break! "Little" as in doll bedding and quilt sets for the Unity Shoppe's Christmas gifts. Every year we work with the wood shop folks at the Wake Center who make beautiful wooden doll cradles (as well as lots of trucks). The cradles are then painted by volunteer artists and we complete the gift with hand-made bedding and quilts.

The directions for making the bedding and quilts are on our website – look under "Community" it will be on your left under "Other Projects.". The kits take very little time to do, especially if they are whole cloth; or simple piecing is best for a quilt of this size. We have done our best to supply each kit with sufficient fabric, batting, a mattress and a pillow, but do feel free to substitute your own fabric if you would like. We have "blank kits" that contain only batting, a mattress and a pillow, if you want complete creative license using your own fabric.

We are on a short time-line: The deadline for the Cradle Kits is the October 13th Guild Meeting. But they are so quick and easy to do that we are sure you can do at least one! But beware, they are addictive! The second one is even easier than the first one, just keep on going, clearing out scraps and making cradle quilts! We've already received bedding sets from some members – Marian Jones made 14, Marty Frolli made 15, and several others others have made a half-dozen each! They are just so easy and so cute!

I hope you are inspired by the joyful thank you note "from a Greatful Kid." We received a whole stack of

heartfelt thank you notes from CALM quilt recipients. While we can't reproduce them all, here are just a few:

"Thanks for taking the time to make the blankets and for the dedication you have. They are beautiful and a great joy to us with their colors and designs."

"Thank you for the blanket! It rocks! I needed it!"

The social workers tell us that the quilts are closely examined and admired. The recipients are overjoyed and often overwhelmed to receive one. The quilts provide not just warmth and comfort but are also teaching opportunities: naming the colors, shapes and animals on a quilt helps to improve language skills. Every quilt is chosen by a social worker for a specific child. We delivered 33 quilts to CALM last month. We delivered 17 quilts to Visiting Nurse and Hospice Care, which were welcomed with joy. VNHC was especially grateful to receive the three red, white and blue quilts.



Block of the Month



*Back to school month!
For some little ones it's the first day of school.
Think primary colors of red, yellow and blue for this one.
Use children's prints if you have them.*

Cutting


Bright red print:
Cut 2 (3-1/2") squares.

Bright yellow print:
Cut 2 (3-1/2") squares.
Cut 2 (3-1/2" x 6-1/2") rectangles.


Bright blue print:
Cut 2 (6-1/2") squares.

Assembly

1. Sew 3-1/2" yellow squares to 3-1/2" red squares. Press to red.
2. Sew 3-1/2" x 6-1/2" yellow rectangles to units from step 1. Press to rectangle.
Unit should measure 6-1/2".
3. Join units to blue squares to make the block. Press to blue squares. Block should measure 12-1/2".
