We asked for Doll Cradle bedding and last month we received 66 sets! With about 50 kits still “out there” being made, we urge you to remember the October deadline.


Natural History Quilt Makes an Encore

Why is that important for you?



Bow Tie
12" Block

November 2016

Block of the Month



*It's off to Grandmother's house we go for Thanksgiving dinner.
Time to get dressed up and don our bow ties.
Use Fall colored prints in brown, green, orange and rust for the Bow Ties.*

Cutting

Bow Tie fabrics:

Cut two 3-1/2" squares and two 2" squares of each bow tie fabric.

Off white, white on muslin or very pale tan print for background:

Cut eight 3-1/2" squares.

Piecing

1. Draw a diagonal line from corner to corner on the wrong side of the 2" squares of bow tie fabric.



2. Lay the 2" square right sides together with a 3-1/2" background square. Sew on the line, being careful not to stretch the bias. Trim seam to 1/4". Press seam to the bow tie fabric.




3. Sew units together to make one Bow Tie. Press the seams toward the bow tie fabric.


Unit measures 6-1/2" x 6-1/2".

Repeat to make four bow tie units. Assemble the four bow ties to make block.

Note the direction of the bow ties. Block should measure 12-1/2".


WIN THIS QUILT!!! Wait just ONE quilt?

Holiday Shopping Can Give Twice! Sue Kadner, Public Relations

With the holidays just months away, we want to remind you that IF you buy from Amazon, the Guild can benefit – through either of two programs:

The first is the **Amazon Associates** program. Go to the Guild's website (www.coastalquilters.org) and click on the Amazon logo in the left column. Sign on and make your purchases; they will earn up to 15% for the Guild! If you don't want to go through the Guild's website *every* time you shop Amazon, go to our website and create a link that you save to your favorites — that way you will never forget and your purchases will automatically be credited! **Remember: You must make your purchases through the Guild's website link for your qualifying purchases to count.** If you are not sure if you are linked, look for the Guild's code (i.e. coastalquil07-20) as part of the web address.

The second is the **Amazon Smile** program which brings the Guild approximately .5% (that is one-half a percent) from most of your purchases. If you have *not* signed up for Amazon Smile and want to, go to smile.amazon.com, enter your information and select your non-profit (hopefully the Coastal Quilters Guild Inc. – Santa Barbara County). You can then create a link to smile.amazon.com because like the Associates Program above, you have to go through the *smile* link for the purchase to qualify. When you are signed on to the Smile Program, it tells you in the left side of the Amazon header.

Note that we are not promoting Amazon but if you are currently not using either program and do buy from Amazon, we hope you will use the Associates Program as we receive more from that one.
