### October Speakers: SB Modern Quilt Guild

We are in for a real treat at the October meeting. Several members of the Santa Barbara Modern Quilt Guild (some of whom are also Coastal Quilters members) will share their journey into Modern Quilting and show guilts they have designed.

About the Modern Quilt Guild: The MQG developed out of the thriving online community of modern guilters and their desire to meet in person. The founding guild was formed in Los Angeles in October 2009. The Santa Barbara MQG started in 2010 as an informal group meeting at the Fabric Quarter. Membership in the MQG was formalized in the summer of 2013; the SBMQG became a formal chapter and is now one of 170 guilds worldwide. There are approximately 12,000 members of the MQG--a small but diverse group of guilters from a variety of backgrounds.

Reminder - the October workshop is an "Open Sew" day at Goleta Community Center.

### November Speaker/Workshop: Dora Cary

At the November meeting, Romanian quilt designer Dora Cary of Orange Dot Quilts will share her love of making patterns and teaching quilting. Described as "fresh and original", Dora's patterns will be featured at the workshop the next day when members will make their choice of one of four Orange Dot patterns. Guild members who have taken a class with Dora say she's a terrific teacher who gives a great workshop.

### President's Message

Threads of Time

I often wondered how quilting started. How can a few threads turn into something so beautiful? Our Guild is reaching its thirtyyear mark and we have seen so many beautiful quilts over the years made by our members. But do you know where it all began?

Quilting has served many functions through the ages (warmth, decoration on a wall/floor, remembrance of a loved one, expression of political views). Quilted garments were known to exist in Egypt as early as 3400 B.C. Crusaders brought quilting from Europe in the Middle Ages. The first reference to quilts in America was at the end of the 1600's. The earliest surviving American quilt is the Saltonstall quilt from 1704.

The Tristan quilt is the oldest quilt in existence. Made around 1360-1400 this quilt is in the Victoria and Albert Museum in London. A second related piece is in the Bargello Museum in Florence Italy. It is assumed that both pieces were made at the same time. The six scenes on the quilt depict the legend of Tristan. "The oppression of Cornwall by King Languis of Ireland and his champion, Amoroldo, and the battle of Tristan on behalf



of his uncle, King Mark." The quilts were done in sections and then joined. Made of linen and stuffed with cotton wadding. The figures are outlined in brown and the background is stitched with white thread.

Too bad we don't know who made it. Remember to always sign/date your quilts. You never know where they might turn up and how long they will survive after you are gone. Someone might be interested in your story.

Read more here: <a href="www.daysforgirls.org">www.daysforgirls.org</a>. We stitch the components and assemble kits at Direct Relief, then kits are shipped to girls and women in impoverished countries, such as Nepal and Uganda. Read more here: <a href="www.directrelief.org">www.directrelief.org</a>. Believe it or not, this helps girls stay in school and women to hold their communities together!

Two pair of panties are included in each kit. So, we're having a PANTY DRIVE. We now have just over 500 panties, but we're shooting for 2000 by December. So, please PULL UP YOUR BIG GIRL PANTIES and pick up some panties at K-Mart, Costco, Target, Kohl's, etc. (Or order online and have package sent to me.)

Bring the panties to the next guild meeting and DROP YOUR DRAWERS at our Days for Girls table. If you can't make the meeting, I'll pick them up. Please help us with this incredible program and DON'T FORGET YOUR PANTIES! Thank you for your support and donations!

NEW panties - NO used.

Size: Girls' size 12-14 and Women's sizes 5-7. Bikini, hipsters or briefs. No boy shorts. Any brand.

Content: Absorbent - Cotton or cotton/poly. No silky/slinky/sexy.

Color: Medium and dark colors are preferable. (If package includes white or pastel panties that's okay because we can dye them.)

Motif: Florals and geometrics are okay. No animals, bugs, insects, faces or eyes. Butterflies okay if no eyes. No animal skin prints, guns, hunting or camouflage. No glitz, glitter or glam. No cartoon, TV, pop culture, flags, food or words.

How can you help?

- Join the DAYSIES and help make kits. Contact Marty Frolli if interested.
- Donate quilters cottons. ¼ yard minimum. Medium to dark values. No whites or lights.
- Donate cotton flannel. Medium to dark values. Yardage is appreciated. Joann's Fabrics has best prices. For cotton and flannel fabrics, please follow the same panty motif guidelines listed above.
- Donate to Direct Relief, directing your funds to this project. Make check payable to Direct Relief, with the notation "DFG/Daysies #430249" to indicate donation is to be used for DAYSIES Days for Girls project.



Block of the Month

#### House Block 12" Finished Block



Light blue for sky.

Medium green for lawn. House fabrics - your choice.


#### Assembly

1. Roof section:

Draw a line corner to corner on the wrong side of two sky squares. With right sides together, align one sky square with the peak rectangle and one sky square with the roof rectangle, as shown. Sew on the line. Trim seam to 1/4". Press seam toward sky. On the wrong side of the peak unit, draw a 45 degree line from the corner, as shown\*. With right sides together, align peak unit with roof unit, as shown. Sew on the line. Trim seam to 1/4". Press seam toward the roof unit.

Complete sky/chimney row and door/window row, referring to diagram for placement. Note pressing arrows.

Sew rows together, matching peaks of roof to chimneys and bottom of roof to corner of house.
