March Speaker

Trudy Smith: "For the Love of Quilting"

Trudy Smith will share her quilting love story and trunk show at the March 14th meeting. Trudy has taught Quilting and Machine Embroidery for Conejo Valley Adult Education for the past 9 years. She has been quilting for over 25 years and calls herself a "dabbler" in all techniques of quilting, but machine applique is her favorite method. Her quilts have been shown at Road to California and Paducah, KY quilt shows. She was the manager of Quilter's Studio in Ventura for over 10 years with expertise in Bernina sewing and embroidery machines.



On March 15th, she will teach a workshop titled "Machine Applique-Mock Hand Applique." Participants will be making the "Funky Flower" square. A kit for \$25.00 will be available for the workshop. You may represent the history of quilting, from vintage to modern, using any technique or fad or any image that conveys the concept—with or without words. Words may be inked, painted, fused, embroidered, etc. Humor is always a hit. We're representing the Guild, so no political expression is permitted. If you submit more than one entry, only your entry with the highest ballot count will be considered in the voting and only one participation favor will be given per member. Questions? It's a honey of a block and so fun to make!



Fabric and Cutting

<p><u>White Fabric:</u> Cut 2 - 1 1/2" x 4 1/2" Cut 2 - 1 1/2" x 2 1/2" Cut 2 - 1 1/2" x 9 1/2" Cut 2 - 1 1/2" x 7 1/2"</p>	<p><u>Any Pink, Orange or Green (in any order)</u> A - Cut 1 - 2 1/2" x 2 1/2" B - Cut 2 - 2" x - 7 1/2" Cut 2 - 2" x - 4 1/2" C- Cut 2 - Cut 2 - 2" x - 12 1/2" . Cut 2 - Cut 2 - 2" x - 9 1/2"</p>	
---	---	--

Assembly (use 1/4" seam allowances)

Use log cabin construction method to build the block from the (A block) center out.

Trim the block to 12 1/2" x 12 1/2", being sure the 'A' square is centered at 6 1/4" mark (x)
