Voting will end midway through the break, when participants will be asked to collect their entries and line up in numerical order for the parade. Info for Participants: Please let me know if you are unable to attend April's meeting so I can arrange a substitute to hold your sign during the parade. If you have multiple entries, join the parade according to your lowest entry number, then arrange your entries from lowest to highest (only your entry with the highest ballot count will be eligible for an award.) Pillowcases will be available for pick up after the awards are given.

Rami Kim: "Asian Designs in a Modern World"

Our speaker in May will be Rami Kim, a DNA scientist turned fabric artist/quilter/instructor known nationally and internationally. She is a 19-time Best of Show winner, distinguished for her innovative art-to-wear. Her passion is in contemporary art-to-wear, quilts, cloth dolls, and bags with special interest in 3-dimensional textures. She is known for her own distinctive colors and techniques.

On May 10, Rami will conduct a workshop entitled "Folded Square & Hexagon for Cross Stitch & Pieced Quilts." Because the pieces include built-in backing, your quilts will already be backed and quilted once all of the "hexies" are


Barb Ervin's Tribute to Our Flag

May 2019

12 x 10 1/2" Block (12.5 x 11" Unfinished)

Coastal Quilters Guild Block of the Month

Reviving this block in honor of the guild's Veterans quilt project. Make lots, they're easy! "This month we're asking you to come up with a modified version of the American flag. If the lucky winner doesn't get the quilt finished by Memorial Day, celebrated on May 30 this year, perhaps she'll make it by Flag Day, which is June 14. "

Fabric and Cutting

The colors you'll be working with are red, white, and blue. The red fabrics may be solid, patterned with small white or cream figures, or tone-on-tone. The white fabrics may be solid or tone-ontone. Civil War reproduction fabrics are fine. Please use the same red and white fabrics throughout. The blue fabric may be solid, patterned, tone-on-tone, or blue and white.

White Fabric: Cut 2 - 2" × 12 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Cut 2 - 2" × 8 $\frac{1}{2}$ "	Red Fabric Cut 2 - 2" × 12 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Cut 2 - 2" × 8 $\frac{1}{2}$ "	Blue Fabric Cut 1 - 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ " × 5"
--	---	--

Assembly (use $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowances

Sew the four long strips together, alternating colors. Press all seams toward the red strips. Sew the short strips together, beginning and ending with a red strip. Again, press all seams toward the red strips. Sew the blue rectangle to the short strip set along a 5" side, then trim it as needed. Sew the two rectangles together, and you're done.
