June Speaker: Cathie Hoover "Accept the Challenge!"

Cathie has had a diversified relationship with fabrics. Graduating with a B.S in Home Economics, she has studied tailoring, pattern drafting, and weaving. Dressmaking, knitting with fabric, quilting, wearable art and machine appliqué are a part of her world. She uses embellishments with decorative stitches, laces, braids, rickrack, and color combinations to create her dynamic quilts. She has taught quilting workshops and lectured throughout much of the U.S..

She will present a slide show of quilts and garments and share personal experiences that led to their creation. While encouraging her audience to say

"yes" to challenges, she will discuss design solutions for those challenges. Examples of her special pieces will also be on display. Please join us on June 13 for an evening with this dynamic, informative, and fun loving teacher!

Workshop: Wild & Crazy Quilt with Curves

Cathie's workshop (June 14) has been praised as both fun and educational. Bring dots, stripes, and a large-scale print. Add blender fabrics in colors found in the large-scale print, in light, medium, and dark values. This block has both curves and straight, diagonal pieces, creating movement not found in traditional blocks. Embellish both blocks and finished top in rickrack, lace, braids and/or decorative stitching and fancy

threads.

Each student's fabric palette will be evaluated and suggestions made for maximum impact. Students can make templates (6 pieces) from template plastic and glue stick or purchase a template set (\$16) at the workshop; rickrack will be available for sale. 



Call for Quilts: Special Exhibit at Road to CA

Southern California Council of Quilt Guilds (SCCQG) is accepting entries for an exhibit at Road to California, January 23 - 26, 2020. Exhibit entries are limited to members of SCCQG Member Guilds or Affiliate Members. (Coastal Quilters is a SCCQG member.)

Road to California ("Road) is celebrating its 25th Anniversary in 2020. You are challenged to create a quilt inspired by Road and that features a technique learned in a Road workshop or uses a pattern/book and/or fabric purchased from a vendor at Road from 1995 – 2019.

Entries are due November 1, 2019 and quilt dimensions must be exactly (W) 32" X (H) 36".



12 x 12" Block (12.5 x 12.5" Unfinished)

Coastal Quilters Guild Block of the Month

In the year 2000, (aka Y2K!) there was a very creative satellite group known as "The Evening Stars" (Lois, Ranell and Marcie) Their theme for the year was Star blocks. They chose this star block for July and it is appropriately named for their group.





Fabric and Cutting

The colors you'll be working with are medium bright blue, dark bright blue and white. The blue fabrics may be solid, patterned or tone-on-tone. The white fabric can be solid or tone-on-tone.

White Fabric: Cut 2 - 4" squares Cut 4 - $3\frac{1}{2}$ " $\times 6\frac{1}{2}$ " Cut 4 - $3\frac{1}{2}$ " $\times 3\frac{1}{2}$ " squares		Medium Bright Blue Fabric (4) 3 1/2" squares (for the flying geese)
---	--	---

Assembly (use $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowances

- Draw a line corner to corner on the two 4" White squares. This is the cutting line. Draw a line
 1/4" from the cutting line and on each side of the cutting line. These are the sewing lines
- Pin White squares and Dark Bright Blue squares right sides together. Stitch on the two sewing lines. Cut on the cutting line. Press seam to the blue. Trim units to 3 ½". Makes four half square triangle squares of background and "Pinwheel" material.
- Sew these four squares together to make center pinwheel unit.
- Make four Flying Geese* with White 3 ½" x 6½" pieces as base, dark blue on left, bright blue on right. (trim to finish at 6½"x3½"). Sew per example to either side of pinwheel unit.
- *Flying Geese Instructions: Draw a line from corner to corner on the wrong side of the blue 3 ½" squares. With right sides together stitch the Dark Blue square to White rectangle, stitching on the drawn line. Trim seam to 1/4". Press seam toward blue fabric. Repeat using the Bright Blue.
- Assemble the top and bottom rows to align as in the example. Sew the rows together to finish.
