## August Workshop *Sheila Collins "Color Me Sunshine"*

Dimensional Fabric Art ~ 16" x 20" Art on Canvas



Sheila loves sunflowers, and believes they are the quintessential flower of summer. Tall, bright, and happy; they definitely put a smile on your face. With this pattern you will learn to make this fabulous blossom working in layers with fusible appliqué and some decorative stitching. You will also become a quick expert working with fabric covered buttons. The center has 57 of them! The finished blossom is glued to a 16" x 20" fabric covered stretch canvas. ## September Workshop *Jennifer Sampou "Octagon Shimmer Quilt"*

Jennifer will teach you to take this traditional quilt block and infuse it with modern style! Pair brights and neutrals with softer tones and accent colors for a bold spiderweb block. Learn to create dynamic movement as you explore positive and negative space, color, and proper value placement. Create pops of accent color improve style like a painter! 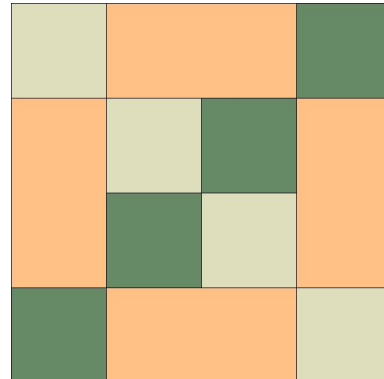

12 x 12" Block (12.5 x 12.5" Unfinished)



*August in the flower garden is amazing. Choose your favorite floral print and enjoy sewing.*

### Cutting

• **White/White-on-White Fabric:**

Cut 4 - 3 1/2" Squares

• **Medium Green Fabric:**

Cut 4 - 3 1/2" Squares

• **Floral Print Fabric:**

Cut 4 - 3 1/2 "x 6 1/2" Rectangles

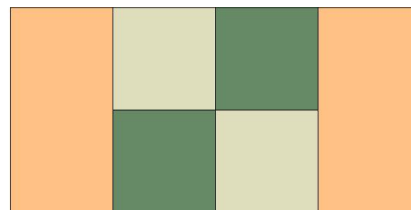
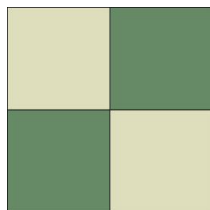
### Assembly

1. Sew Center 4 squares together. Press toward green squares. Sew center unit to Rectangles. Press toward Rectangles.

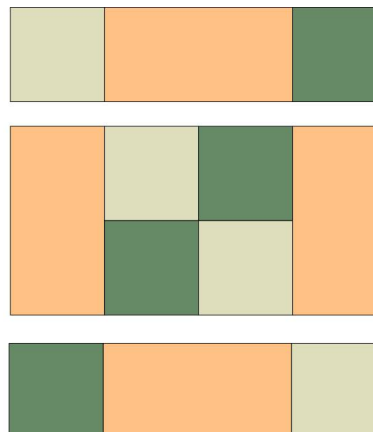
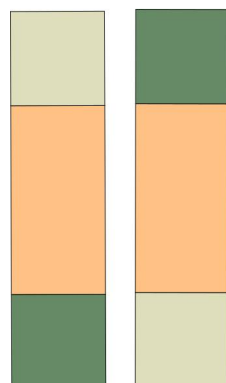
2. Sew Squares to Rectangles Press toward Rectangles. Join units to make the block.

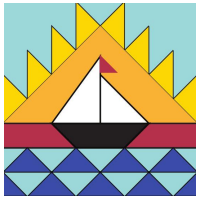
