January Speaker: Edyta Sitar, "Reason for Quilting"

Internationally known teacher and quilt designer Edyta Sitar (Laundry Basket Quilts) will be our guest speaker in January. For her presentation at the *January 9* meeting, she will give a presentation called "Reasons for Quilting." She's also a fabric designer, having designed fabric collections for Moda and now Andover. January Workshop: "Winter Village"

Friday, *January 10*, Edyta Sitar will lead a workshop based on her "Winter Village" pattern, which can be made as a single block, a table runner, or a quilt. There is space for a few more in the workshop, but it's filling up fast. There is a \$40 kit fee, which includes the pattern, or you can buy just the pattern for \$20 and use your own fabrics.

February Speaker and Workshop

Have you been wanting to try your hand at collage quilting? Or maybe you have done some already and would like to do more? Our *February 13* speaker is Janis Rivera, a Laura Heine-certified teacher, who will talk on "Collage Quilting without Falling to Pieces." Friday, *February 14*, she will teach a workshop called "Teeny Tiny Under the Sea," from a new line of Laura Heine patterns (Sea turtle, mermaid in a jar, and octopus are all included in the pattern). Patterns are \$25, and optional kits are also available. *Please remember the workshop fee is now \$45. This begins with the February Workshop.*













As I am writing this, 2019 is rushing out and 2020 will soon be upon us. I have been serving as your president for six months and the time has flown by. According to the old adage, I must be having fun!

Moving into the new year, and the second half of our fiscal year, I want to share my concerns about our financial status. While we have investments to support our low-income years, it is in our best interest to try to maintain a balanced budget. This year, unfortunately, it is not. We will be reviewing our budget and doing what we

can. However, there are not many places where we can cut expenses. In fact, our facility fees have been increased substantially at both our meeting and workshop venues. As a result of this, we have already made the decision to raise our workshop fees by \$5 beginning in February. Speakers are booked well in advance and penalties can be charged if we cancel or postpone them, but that is something we will consider, if appropriate. The Quilt Show income will primarily come in during the early part of the next fiscal year.

To help us get through this year without a serious hit on our savings, I am encouraging all members to purchase or sell, at a minimum, their allotment (\$20 worth) of Opportunity Quilt tickets. If all members do this, it would bring over \$4000 to our coffers. And quite possibly, you could win that beautiful quilt. Donations are also always welcome, and of course, are tax deductible.

If you have any ideas about helping our budget, the board would be happy to consider them. Our Board meeting is the 3rd Thursday of the month at 6:30 in the Maravilla's Craft Room (on the right end of the building.)

I hope you all enjoyed our December meeting. Many of you commented that it was nice to have time to visit with friends. And the pincushion exchange was fun. I'm sad I didn't get mine made.

I want to wish all of you a wonderful and creative 2020.

ROAD TO CALIFORNIA OUILT SHOW BUS TRIP 2020



2020 Challenge: The 3 T's Due March 12, 2020

Entries for the 3T's challenge for April 2020 are due at the March Guild meeting. The 3 Ts are - use a TECHNIQUE new-to-you, plus TWO TYPES of embellishments. A technique which you have never tried before may be how your entry is constructed or embellished. Entries must be a rectangular three layer quilt, perimeter not exceeding 120" with a 4" hanging sleeve. A new technique "sample" is no longer required. The source of your new technique should be stated on the Challenge entry form, available in February.

Suzy Pelovsky loves learning and embellishing. Please select a new technique then add a little bling to a small quilted piece. This fun and interesting member challenge will be educating to all attending Challenge night. Thank you, the Sew It All's.

Marborg Announces Their New Textile Recycling Program

Did you know that textile waste has increased 811% since 1960, and most of this waste ends up in landfills? In fact, textile waste accounts for 8% of all landfilled municipal solid waste – that's a lot of waste! In the United States, we are large consumers of clothing and often discard perfectly good items that someone else could wear. Residents are now able to drop off clean textiles at MarBorg's Goleta Recycling Center and the County of Santa Barbara's South Coast Recycling and Transfer Station. Textiles collected through this program will be picked up by T-Waste Solutions to be be reused or recycled. A majority of these textiles will be sent overseas for people to use as clothing, and the remaining textiles are recycled into shop rags and sold to local businesses.

Quilt Walk Sculpture - Panguitch, UT

The winter of 1864 was a particularly brutal one, and it hit the town of Panguitch, Utah (then called Fairview) hard. Food supplies were dwindling to dangerously low levels when town leaders decided to take extraordinary measures to save the community from potential starvation.



Two rescue parties were sent out to seek food supplies from other "nearby" rural communities in Utah. One party attempted to travel 110 miles north to Gunnison, while the other would have to trek 40 miles west over the mountains to Parowan. The group traveling north were quickly impeded by harsh weather conditions and had to turn back. Meanwhile, the seven rescuers who trekked west over the mountains eventually had to give up their oxen team and wagon to travel through deep drifts of snow on foot.

As they were struggling, the rescuers stopped to pray for guidance. While doing so they knelt on the quilts and blankets that had been provided for warmth. As they did this, the group realized they were not sinking into the snow while kneeling. This gave them the idea of using their supply of quilts and blankets as a way to travel across the snowfields on foot without exhausting themselves. Essentially, the quilts became snowshoes. The rescue party was able to secure enough food and provisions to supply the town for the rest of winter and deliver it safely back home.

Since 1998, this heroic event is celebrated and remembered in Panguitch with an annual Quilt Walk Festival on the second week of June. Preceding each year's festival, colorful quilts are displayed throughout town. More recently, a memorial and small park were completed and dedicated to the 7-member rescue party who successfully made this trek.

From her photographs, Hollis drew the original illustrations for her coloring book titled Stories of West Africa. These drawings, done in col-

ored pencil, were scanned, enlarged, digitally printed on cotton fabric, and then machine quilted. Each quilt tells a story showing the strength of family and community, while the backgrounds show lively African fabrics which play an important role in the everyday life of this region.





Block of the Month for Feruary 2020 Antique Tile

12 x 12" Block (12.5" x 12.5" Unfinished)





February is the month of Valentines and love. Spread some love this month!

Cutting

• White or white on white print:

Cut 4 - 2 1/2" Squares

Cut 4 - 2 1/2" x 4 1/2" Rectangles

• Pink print:

Cut 1 - 4 1/2" Square

Cut 4 - 2 1/2" Squares

Cut 4 - 2 1/2" x 4 1/2" Rectangles

• Red print:

Cut 4 - 2 1/2" x 4 1/2" Rectangles

Assembly


Use 1/4" seam allowances.

1.Sew pink and red rectangles together to make four side units. Press seams to the red rectangles.







2. Sew small white squares and small pink squares together. Press seams to the pink squares. Add white rectangles. Press seams to white rectangles. Make four corner units.






3. Arrange units and center square to make the Antique Tile block. Sew into rows. Press seams toward rectangle units. Sew rows together.
