March Speaker: Pam Hadfield

Our *March 12* speaker and workshop presenter is Pam Hadfield, from Laguna Niguel. Pam taught quilting at Saddleback College for Community Education and her quilts have won awards at Road to California, Nashville AQS, Grand Rapids AQS, and Paducah. Her quilts have also been exhibited at Houston International Quilt Show and published in *Quilter's Newsletter*, *Quiltmania*, and *American Quilter magazine*. For her presentation, Pam will share a trunk show of her many quilts featuring a variety of techniques including piecing, appliqué with cotton and wool, mixed techniques, and pictorial quilts.



March Workshop: "Whimsy Dresdens"

"Whimsy Wedges" is the topic of Pam's workshop Friday, *March 13*. Have you seen the Dresden-based circles of houses popping up on Instagram and elsewhere? Those and other designs are what members can create with the Whimsy Wedges Pam will teach. Part of the fun is that everybody's will be different, thanks to the different fabrics chosen. You can also choose to do a pillow, table runner, wall quilt, or bed quilt. There are spaces available.

May Speaker and Workshop: Award winning Quilter Mel Beach

Coming up in May our speaker is another Road to California award winner, Mel Beach. Join us at the May Guild meeting for "Free Motion CREA-TV and Reality." Her workshop on Friday, *May 15* will be "Modern Free-Motion Fillers and Fun!".



If you have been wanting a little encouragement to do more free motion quilting on your domestic machine (maybe for your quilt show entry?), this might just be what you were looking for. You can see Mel on the February 22 episode of the Quilting Arts TV show, where she demonstrates working with unconventional materials (in one case, origami-folded dollar bills) while combining them with free-motion quilting.

For all members entering the 2020 Guild Challenge, the March 12th meeting is the time to turn in your entry. Entry forms may be downloaded from the website. If you need a printed form, contact Carol Hart. If you are unable to attend in March, please have another member deliver your entry & entry form for you. Your entry requires a 4" hanging sleeve and a label (with at least entry title, your name, phone #). Please deliver your entry in an appropriate protective cover which also has your identification boldly evident and secure- name, address, phone. A guiltcase (novelty print or commercial pillowcase) is fine for most entries. If your entry requires SH (special handling), make either a hard-sided cardboard carrier or use a pool noodle to roll your entry around, then slip into a quiltcase. Since the meeting room to the left of the kitchen will have the Show Meeting in progress, please take your entries to the open space beyond the library, in front of the church entrance doors nearer to the church office. Members of the Sew It Alls satellite group will be waiting to receive your entry. Thank you for participating in the Guild's annual April Challenge Show.

Rosie Lee Tompkins: A Retrospective

February 19 - July 19, 2020

Quoting from the BAMPFA website:

"The Berkeley Art Museum and Pacific Film Archive (BAMPFA) announced in October, 2019 its acquisition of nearly 3,000 works by African American quilt makers, including more than 500 pieces by the acclaimed artist Rosie Lee Tompkins, from the late Oakland collector Eli Leon.

The Eli Leon Collection, believed to be the largest of its kind, comprises quilts as well as assemblage and embroidery by more than 400 black artists. Leon, who collected the works for decades and died in 2018, willed the collection to BAMPFA in what the museum called one of the largest bequests of African American art ever donated to a United States museum.

The collections forms the basis of a major retrospective opening February 19, 2020 of some 80 quilts by Tompkins, an internationally renowned Richmond artist championed by Leon, including previously unseen pieces. Outgoing BAMPFA director Lawrence Rinder, who's co-curating the retrospective with Elaine Yau, previously worked with Leon to show Tompkins' work in 1997.

In 2022, BAMPFA will also mount an exhibition showcasing the broader collection, which includes pieces by some 400 artists such as Arbie Williams, Lawrence Brackens, Gladys Henry, Sherry Byrd and Angie Tobias".





Block of the Month for April 2020 Churn Dash

12 x 12" Block (12.5" x 12.5" Unfinished)





April finds us hopeful for showers and yearning for spring flowers. Stitch this cheerful block in happy bright green and delightful blue florals. Before you know it, Spring will be sprung!

Cutting

• White or White-on-White print:

Cut 1 - 4 1/2" Square

Cut 2 - 5 1/4" Squares

Cut 4 - 2 1/2" x 4 1/2" Rectangles

• Bright Green:

Cut 4 - 2 1/2" x 4 1/2" Rectangle

• Medium Blue Floral:

Cut 2 - 5 1/4" Squares

Assembly

For best results, please use scant 1/4" seams.

1. Draw a line corner to corner on the two 5 1/4" white squares. This is the cutting line. Draw a line 1/4" from the cutting line on both sides of the cutting line to make sewing line.




2. Pin White 5 1/4" squares to Blue 5 1/4" squares. Sew each unit on the sewing lines. Cut on the cutting line. Press seams to the Blue. Trim the four units to 4 1/2" square.



3. Sew the White rectangles to the Bright Green rectangles. Press seam toward the green.



4. Arrange the triangle units, the rectangle units and the white square to make the Churn Dash block. Sew into rows. Press seams toward the rectangle units. Sew the rows together. Block should measure 12 1/2" square.
