It's hard to believe that it has been four months since this pandemic shut-down began. In some ways it seems like much longer, and others much shorter. I hope everyone continues to stay safe and healthy.

The Southern California Council of Quilt Guilds held its quarterly meeting via Zoom on July 18. I,
 along with a few of your CQG Leadership team, attended the meeting. The topic for this meeting was Virtual Meetings. I am proud to say that CQG is keeping up successfully with this trend, thanks to Susan Katz, Ranell Hansen and Bonnie Barber. I refer to this group as our "tech team."

While we are still unable to meet in person, it is important for us to continue the business and services of the Guild to the best of our ability. Beginning on August 13, we will have our regular evening Guild meeting, except we will be meeting on Zoom. Watch for more information about this meeting elsewhere in this newsletter and via email blasts. We are also looking into doing virtual workshops. If you have not experienced using Zoom, please do not be afraid to join us. We have people who can help you get started; and it's a lot of fun to see friends and be inspired. Be sure to renew your membership if you have not done so already.

The latest Mask Update was sent to the email group on $7 / 16$, and I told the group we could stand down for a while. The next day, Governor Gavin Newsom announced the rules for school reopening, which includes the requirement for masks to be worn by students in 3rd grade and above. My next update will be asking the group to fire up again. We will be focusing on student masks, but may also need more adult masks as well. I want to encourage anyone who has not yet participated to help with this effort. To date, only about 50 people have submitted masks, and some are not even Guild members. In some cases, we have been able to use this project to supplement our finances (with donations and sale of masks) which is particularly helpful since our Quilt Show has been postponed.

## Guild Workshops

Over the years, quilting and sewing have been my solace and my joy. Even in the midst of the most demanding phases of life, when there was precious little 'spare' time, I always fit time in to sew. Even the smallest project would provide the balance that saw me through.

Recently, we were discussing the many benefits of Guild membership and it was agreed that programs and workshops were high on the list. I wanted to share just a few specific Guild learning experiences and how they have helped me.

## Sewing patches on the Kiwanis Club banners

The club wanted to honor and recognize past and present club officers, so a large number of patches were created. Knowing my sewing obsession, they asked me to do the honors. As I planned the project, I remembered the technique I learned in the March 2019 Trudy Smith's "Machine Ap-pliqué-Mock Hand Appliqué" workshop. We learned to secure turned edge applique using clear thread in the sewing machine. Clear thread was the perfect solution for neatly stitching all thirty-four(!) patches to the banner.

## Flange Binding

At the 2018 Quilt Show, the Education group distributed how-to hints. I was so happy with the results achieved with the flange binding hint that nearly every quilt I have made since has had that distinctive finish. The 'hint' is pinned to the white board in my sewing room, consulted each time I have bound a quilt since then. At Edyta Sitar's workshop in January 2020, she taught her 'Winter Village' project and so much more. One of the wonderful tips she shared during the workshop was a simple technique for taking bulk out of the flange binding.

## Art Quilting

I have been fortunate to attend Guild workshops with renowned improvisational quilt artists like Freddy Moran and Jean Wells who have enabled me to grow creative muscles that I didn't know I had.

The Sewjourners Satellite group exhibit at the Art Fund Gallery in 2018 inspired me to rejoin and whole-heartedly support the Guild after being a sporadic member for many years.

I have heard it said (and I agree) that we learn valuable skills at every workshop we attend. Sometimes, the lesson is that we don't want to pursue the skill being taught. I would argue that many more times, we gain tools and skills that inform us far into the future. I am excited to engage in upcoming workshop experiences that the Guild is planning. I encourage everyone to join in and to share.

## Amazon Smile

For the past several years, we have been promoting the Amazon Associate program over the Amazon Smile program because the commissions were higher. Many of you have the Associate program link bookmarked. We recently learned that we are no longer eligible for the Associate program we have heard of other non-profits who were also disconnected - so we are asking that, if you buy from Amazon and have not designated another non-profit organization via the Smile program, please go to the Guild's website and in the bottom left corner of the home page there is link to the Amazon Smile program. Sign on with your Amazon account and designate "Coastal Quilters Guild" as your non-profit of choice. If you have already done so, it will show in the upper left as shown below:


To shop at Amazon Smile, you must sign on via the Smile link from your computer. If you go through https://amazon.com, it will not generate a donation for the Guild. We suggest you delete your Amazon bookmark and instead bookmark smile.amazon.com.

Mobile users need to register in the Amazon Shopping App for the Smile Program. You must set up the app for Amazon Smile shopping. In Android,
this is done from the app's "hamburger menu." For iPhone and iPad purchases made on the shopping app are eligible for Smile. Purchases made from any Kindle E-reader device through the Kindle E-readers using the iOS operating system are not eligible for donations.

This program provides $0.5 \%$ to the Guild for every purchase that is covered by the Smile program. The purchase price is the amount paid for the item minus any rebates and excluding shipping and handling, gift-wrapping fees, taxes or service charges. Amazon Smile offers a simple and automatic way for you to support Coastal Quilters every time you shop at no cost to you.

Signing up is really easier than the above description implies but if you need assistance, please email Sue Kadner at sgkadner@coastalquilterssb.org and she will get in touch to help you sign up.

## Community Projects

Doll cradle kits are now available! Stop by my front porch and help yourself to BASICS kits which include a pre-cut foam mattress, a completed pillow and an oversized batting square for the quilt top. We also have separate bundles of rough cut (oversized) fabrics for the quilt top and back, mattress and pillowcase. Use your own stash with the BASICS kit or enhance the fabric bundles with pieces from your stash.

Remember: while additions like buttons, glitter, and faux furs may look cute to you, these cradle bedding sets are being used by small children (think of choking hazards) and must be able to withstand multiple washings.

These items are available from 8 am- 8 pm everyday. You are welcome to drop off any completed cradle sets (or other community quilts) on the porch as well. Should you not be able to come to my porch, I am happy to come to yours - just let me know what you need. My address is in our directory.

# Block of the Month for September 2020 Flock of Birds 

$12 \times 12^{\prime \prime}$ Block (12.5" $\times 12.5^{\prime \prime}$ Unfinished)


Imagine a flock of birds flying around your favorite building. This block looks complicated, but it is very easy.

## Cutting

- White Solid or White on White:

Cut 10-2 7/8" Squares

- Light Blue:

Cut 10-27/8" Squares

## - Orange:

Cut 4-41/2" Squares

## Assembly

For best results, please use scant $1 / 4$ " seams.

1. Make the Half-Square Triangles (HST):

- Draw a line corner to corner on each of the white squares. This is your cutting line. Draw a line 1/4" from the cutting line on both sides of the cutting line to make a sewing line.
- Pin white squares to blue squares. Sew each unit on the sewing lines. Cut on the cutting line. Open the square and press the seams to the blue.


2. Following the diagram, sew two half square triangles together. Sew these two triangles to one side of the orange square making sure that the white touches the orange (Unit A). Press towards the orange.

3. Sew three half square triangles together watching the placement, and sew this unit to Unit A with the white touching the orange. Make four of these.

4. Lay out the blocks and rotate them to match the diagram. Sew two blocks together then sew the two units of two together.
