Kathy Doughty, our July speaker, is another wellknown quilter zooming to us from Australia. Kathy started quilting in 1993 shortly after relocating to Australia from her home in the USA. She found her community amongst the quilters she met through her craft.



In 2003, Material Obsession was created. It is a place where quilters are encouraged to experiment with textiles, design, and method. Kathy loves traditional

President's Message

It feels very strange to be writing a newsletter article as Guild President. If you'd asked ten years ago if that was even a remote possibility, I would have laughed out loud!

I have always been a creative person. I grew up near Manchester in the north of England, doing crossstitch embroidery, loved my coloring books, and made several stuffed



toys and miniature books. I even did some English paper piecing, though its place within the larger world of quilting meant nothing to me as a seven year old. Quilting was not something that ran in my family. We didn't have handmade quilts; as far as I know, nobody in my family had ever quilted.

Then in October 2009 I moved to California, following in the path of my husband's job. I had no job, and I knew almost nobody. Fortunately SBCC ran free classes so I embraced that as a way of filling my time and meeting people: and in Spring 2010 my first ever quilting class - a beginners' class, making a traditional sampler, with Marty Frolli. I loved it! I had no sewing machine, no tools, no stash and no real concept of what I'd started! But everyone was so friendly and welcoming that I soon settled into this most American of hobbies.

I really don't know how many quilts I've made since somewhere around sixty, I believe, though I've started many more. I still only have two sewing machines, but now also have a huge stash of fabric and tools - specialty rulers anyone?! And I have so many friends!

I think my first Coastal Quilters Guild meeting must also have been in the spring of 2010. In that time I have been in a couple of satellite groups, been newsletter editor and Block of the Month coordinator, Challenge coordinator (twice), Zoom tech-support and worked every quilt show even when I was eight months pregnant!!

And now I somehow find myself as Guild President... I'm not sure if I am the youngest ever president (I must check with the founding members of our Guild), but I'm certainly the youngest for some time. I'm also fairly certain I'm

August Speaker: Jen Kingwell

Our August speaker will be Jen Kingwell coming to us from Melbourne, Australia. Jen grew up on a farm in a very rural setting where there was no sewing machine. She discovered her love of textiles at a young age when a friend's mom gave her a bundle of scraps, and she

cherished them. Jen states that she's always loved color, prints, textiles and, most of all, hand stitching. Jen made her first little quilt when she started nurse's training (she's a midwife too) and became obsessed with quilting. Now she's a very well-known and highly acclaimed quilting teacher, writer, and pattern designer. She says she doesn't always follow the rules. She is a girl after my heart! Many of Jen's quilts are made from basic blocks, and she loves vintage quilts. She describes herself as a traditional quilter with a modern twist. She loves scrappy quilts and the more fabrics she can use in a single project the happier she is. In her perfect world she would hand stitch everything but with today's busy lifestyle she does machine piecing as well. Hand appliqué and quilting are among her favorite pastimes.

Jen is a teacher, a fabric designer, and a small business owner as she has owned quilt stores for 15 years. She currently owns Amitie Textiles in Melbourne (www.amitie.com.au) and is on Instagram as @amitie_textiles. The store offers an eclectic mix of fabrics including Japanese prints, Liberty of London, linens from Europe, French toile's, and a wide collection of patchwork fabrics including Moda!

Block of the Month for August 2021 Arkansas Traveler

12" x 12" Block (12.5" x 12.5" unfinished)

Cutting2.5" squares - Cut 8 of black2.5" x 6 .5" rectangles - Cut 1 of each color2 1%" squares - Cut 2 of each color2 1%" squares - Cut 8 of black

Assembly

- 1. Start off by making the half square triangles (HST) first.
- 2. Put with black and the colors. You will make 16 HF, 4 of each color.
- Put right sides together a color and black. Draw a line diagonally across the color. Sew ¼" on each side of the diagonal line. Cut on the line and press to dark color.
- 4. Sew two HST on each side of the 2 ½" square. Do this for each color. Sew these units on each side of the 2 ½" x 6 ½" rectangle. Do this for each color.
- 5. Put the units together.
