I've had memory quilts commissioned by coworkers of a retiring colleague, and parents who want their college freshman to have a quilt made out of their baby clothes. I recently made a "making memories quilt" for someone who is adopting their first child: they gave me clothing to make a quilt out of with the intention of making a welcoming gift for their new daughter.

And it's that intention I believe that sets memory quilts apart from other quilts. All quilts can provide warmth and comfort, but memory quilts provide a kind of spiritual solace in addition to that. They help us preserve the stories and presence of loved ones."

Congratulations to Guild member Maria Dzreeva on receiving first prize in the Miniature Quilt category at this year's <u>Festival of Quilts</u>, held at the National Exhibition Centre in Birmingham, England. Maria's 28.5 x 22 cm quilt, "Woodland Meadow", was inspired by the designs of William Morris and constructed using cotton fabric, tulle, silk and polyester threads.

The judges commented, "the winning piece was beautifully executed with subtly coloured design. The quilting and embellishment do not overwhelm the piece but complement it. Overall it retains the soft qualities of a quilt." Great job, Maria!

Throughout the pandemic, agencies that previously wanted quilts and pillow cases either did not respond to requests, or said "No" to our donation letters. Finally, with things easing up some, and many of the Not For Profit groups gearing up

their services, we again have people who want our donations.

Pamela has arranged with Meals on Wheels to provide placemats for their participants. We may have all that we need for right now, but we will keep you posted when we need more. We are still working on contacting Food from the Heart. Placemats are so much fun to make. They are, after all, miniature quilts. Their small size allows you to quilt them yourself and thereby practice your machine quilting techniques. It's a win-win!

We have also had a request from Garden of Hope for quilts for their 87 residents. We have yet to finalize their needs.

Unity Shop just notified us that the cradle kits are not due until November, but that's coming up really soon so keep working on them. Our Cradle Quilt kits are available at the in-person meeting on Guild Thursdays, or you can pick them up at Linda Estrada's house.

We were pleased with the turnout at the in-person meeting at St. Andrews Church last month. We will be there again on October 14 with cradle kits, dollar a pound fabric, and this time we will have raffle quilt tickets available to purchase for our Holiday Opportunity quilt. Tickets are \$5.00 each and the drawing will be part of our December meeting. Please keep making those amazing community quilts and projects. We are a talented bunch and it is very gratifying to be able to share our talents with folks who appreciate them so much.


Block of the Month for November 2021 Thanksgiving Puzzle

12" x 12" Block (12.5" x 12.5" unfinished)

Make this block out of white and a print that will suggest Thanksgiving.



Cutting Cut eight 3 ⁷/₈" squares of white and eight 3 ⁷/₈" squares of the Thanksgiving print.



Assembly

- 1. Make 16 half square triangles (HST)
- 2. Put the white and Thanksgiving print right sides together. Draw a line diagonally across the white and sew 1/4" on each side of the line. Cut on the line and press to the dark side.
- 3. You will have 16 HST. Trim to 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ " squares.
- 4. Sew it together following the picture.
