### January Program: Carl Hentsch "My Life in Quilts" Trunk Show


January 13, 2022 Guild Meeting at 6 pm via Zoom

Our January speaker will be Zooming from another time zone. Because of the time difference, our meeting will begin at 6:00 PM (PST) with Carl's presentation first. The business meeting will follow.

Throughout his childhood, Carl was surrounded by women who quilted. At the tender age of 6, with the help of his mother, he created his first quilt for his newborn niece. His interest in creating continued to grow and at the age of 12, he was



designing dresses for that niece. When in the Air Force, he began knitting and finally in the late 1990's began to follow the Eleanor Burns and Fons & Porter TV programs. This was the stimulus that launched him into his serious quilting career. He has been featured in many American Quilter's Society shows. His quilt "Love Me Knot" was created for a Hoffman Challenge and chosen to be part of the traveling trunk show. This same quilt was displayed at the International Quilt Market in Houston. He has designed many patterns as well as published books.



Carl will be discussing his journey as a quilter as he displays many of the quilts he has made, including his original designs which have been published in his books as well as quilts completed for various magazines and fabric manufacturers. Please join us to see and hear how his quilting aesthetic has changed through the years "making the modern traditional and the traditional modern".

#### From the Programs Desk

Some quilty thoughts for the new year...
... from the Programs desk

Here's a question for you as we head into month 22 of the pandemic: how's your sewing mojo?

My own has been like a sine wave. When we were first staying at home, I thought it would be just fine -- after all, I had a ton of UFOs waiting to be finished, and a ton more new projects I was eager to start. I enthusiastically rolled up my sleeves and quilted along with Edyta Sitar's mystery quilt 2020, making those 100 blocks like it was my job. Then I took a few Zoom workshops, missing quilting at the same table with friends, but thrilled that we could do something - anything - to keep learning fun new techniques or perspectives on quilting.

And then my sewjo decided to go on walkabout. Oh, sure, I still loved going into my sewing room to move fabric around - but despite the boxes of projects still undone, I couldn't really pick one to make progress on. Then, one day, as mysteriously as it had disappeared, my sewjo was back in gear again.

All this to say, if you've had some fits and starts with your sewing projects over the past couple of years, I hear you.

And this is exactly why we thought it would be fun to start out 2022 with a big explosion of color found in Carl Hentsch's New York Beauty quilts - which he's going to show us in his presentation at our January 13 meeting (starting at 6 p.m.) - and then with his January 15 workshop, where we can try our own hand at making a block or four of his Crazy Tula quilt.

If your quilting sewjo has been on a bit of a hunger strike lately, this is your invitation to give it a jump start by joining your fellow CQG members in our first Zoom workshop of 2022. All you have to do is go to our Coastal Quilters website, click on the Programs page, and sign up right there. It's just \$50, a lot less than a class at Road or Asilomar. If you have a non-CQG friend who'd like to join us, they can sign up too, for just \$10 more.

As always, we'll have the Zoom doors open at 8:45 before the workshop starts at 9 a.m., so you can say "hi" to your friends and newcomers. Look forward to seeing you there!

# January Workshop: "Crazy Tula"

January 15, 2022, at 9 am via Zoom

Carl Hentsch and Tula Pink joined forces in creating this pattern "Crazy Tula". Carl writes, "This was an awesome collaboration with Tula's color sense and my complex quilt designs." Many of Tula Pink's fabrics can be found at Roxanne's quilt shop in Carpinteria. In this all day workshop, the student will



learn the paper piecing method and construct 3 squares which should provide a good start for making the whole quilt. Carl will take us step-by-step and teach us to make these intricate, amazing and colorful blocks.

A requirement for the workshop is Carl's book "New York Beauties & Flying Geese" which is available on Amazon in paperback or for your Kindle. All supplies and fabric suggestions needed, along with directions for making the quilts can be found in the book. You can register for this workshop on the Guild's website. The fee for members is \$50.00. Come and expand your quilting knowledge with your quilting friends at this January workshop!

### Block of the Month for February 2022 Scrap Happy


12" x 12" Block (12.5" x 12.5" unfinished)

Make this block out of some of your scraps, prints and solids. I chose 4 colors.

#### Cutting

- In each of four colors:
  - Cut two 3 1/8" squares of a solid color
  - Cut two 3 1/8" squares of a print.
  - You will be putting these together in a 6 ½" square.





#### **Assembly**

Make four half square triangles (HST) per square.

- 1. Put a print and a solid right sides together. Draw a line diagonally across the back side of the square. Sew ¼" on each side of the line. Cut on the line. 2 HST made. Make 4 HST per color.
- 2. Put these together in squares like the picture, then sew the squares together
