April Program: Timna Tarr "Flying Colors Trunk Show"

April 14, 2022 Guild Meeting at <u>6 pm</u> via Zoom

Contemporary quilter Timna Tarr describes herself as an "improviser with planning tendencies". Her work revolves around color and small compositions. Each block in a quilt is made as its own element, independent of the other blocks. After all the blocks are sewn, she works her magic and arranges them to play off each other and work together to create a larger whole, which may include hundreds of different fabrics. Timna



loves to watch how the project changes and transforms with the addition of each color and texture. She purchases fabric in a way that might be a bit foreign to some of us as she only buys 1/4 to 1/3 of a yard of fabric at a time, which then forces her to be more creative.



Even though her mother and grandmother were quilters, Timna had no desire to follow in their footsteps until 20 years after graduating from college with a degree in Art History.

Since then, she has custom designed and quilted thousands of quilts. Her nationally award-winning quilts have been seen in numerous exhibits, quilting magazines, and books. She has been winning awards at quilt shows since 2010, with the most recent being the Judge's Choice at the 2021 Vermont Quilt Festival.

Timna will be joining us from the East coast time zone so her presentation will begin at 6:00 PM Pacific time. Our Guild business meeting will follow.

Annual Business Meeting & Election

In accordance with our by-laws, please note that the annual members' meeting will be held on **Thursday**, **May 12, 2022, at 7:00pm on Zoom**. Voting on the nominated slate of officers for fiscal year 2022/2023, and the proposed by-law changes will be done by mail. Recommended Coastal Quilters Guild Bylaw Changes

At their March 17, 2022, meeting, the Board approved submitting the following <u>proposed</u> Bylaw changes to the Guild membership. Members will have the chance to vote on these proposed changes on the ballot that will be sent to you in May.

Section 8.3, Election Committee:

<u>Note</u>: Since the Bylaws were updated in 2020, there has been some confusion about usage of the word 'slate' and when various election procedures should take place. The proposed revision of this section is intended to resolve those issues by making clear the duties of the Elections Committee, including when the names of candidates should be announced and when nominations for elected positions close.

Current Wording:

8.3.a: The Elections Committee shall review duties and qualifications for elected and non-elected positions, recruit candidates and prepare a slate of qualified candidate(s) for elected positions and a list of interested candidates for non-elected positions.

8.3.b: At the March General Meeting, the Chair shall present the proposed slate and ask for nominations from the floor. The final slate of candidates, and the names of the President's appointees for non-elected positions, shall be published in the April newsletter together with notice of the May Annual meeting and elections.

8.3.c: The Elections Committee shall have responsibility for handling all aspects of the election process at the May Annual meeting and other meetings of the members.

Proposed Wording:

8.3.a: It is the responsibility of the Elections Committee to recruit candidates for all elected positions and prepare a slate of candidates qualified per section 8.2.

8.3.b: It is the responsibility of the Elections Committee to prepare for the President a list of members interested in being appointed to non-elected positions.

8.3.c: The Chair of the Elections Committee shall ask for nominations for elected positions no later than the February General Meeting and include the list in the February newsletter and/or e-blasts. Nominations will close as of the due date for the April newsletter. The final slate of candidates shall be published in the April newsletter together with notice of the May Annual meeting and elections.

8.3.d: The Elections Committee shall have responsibility for handling all aspects of the election process at the May Annual meeting and other meetings of the members.

Section 7.4, Voting at Members' Meetings:

<u>Note</u>: Currently our bylaws <u>only</u> allow election of officers and directors <u>by ballot</u>. The proposed change would allow "election by acclamation" for unopposed candidates. An acclamation is a form of election that does not require a ballot. We recently learned that elections by acclamation are allowed under Robert's Rules but we cannot use this method unless our Bylaws are modified to allow. If proposed Bylaw is approved, any candidate who runs unopposed would be elected "by acclamation" without the need for a ballot vote. This would simplify election of unopposed candidates.

Current Wording

7.4.c: Voting may be by voice or ballot, except that any election of officers and directors must be by ballot.

Proposed Wording:

7.4.c: Voting may be by voice or ballot, except that officers and directors must be elected by ballot or acclamation. Changes to the Bylaws or other legal documents must be by ballot. A candidate who runs <u>opposed</u> must be elected by ballot. A candidate who runs <u>unopposed</u> will be elected by acclamation, not ballot. The Chair of the Election Committee, or their designee, will announce the names of the officers and directors elected by ballot and those elected by acclamation at the May meeting and the results will be published in the June newsletter

We hope our explanation makes sense and you will approve these changes on the May ballot. If there are questions, please contact <u>sgkadner@coastalquilters.org</u> and she will get in touch with you to help resolve.



- **Suzy Kassem** Rise Up and Salute the Sun: The Writings of Suzy Kassem Have you started your Challenge project? The 2022 Quilt Challenge will use the poem, "Circles of Life",



by Suzy Kassem for inspiration. Entries are due May 12 - more info soon.

Challenge Requirements:

- include 3 types of circles these can be in the fabric used, an embellishment, an attached shape, in the quilting, etc.- be creative!:
- may use a line/phrase from the poem in lieu of one type of circle;
- include a recognizable amount of the color orange;
- have more/less than 4 sides on the finished piece - no 4-sided entries;
- have 3 layers, be quilted in some manner and be made only by the participant;
- can be made from a pattern created by someone else but the work must be only the participant's;
- may be 3-dimensional;
- due to space restraints, size should be limited to a perimeter of 120" or less;
- be a new piece, begun in response to this challenge;
- Challenge elements must be on the front of the entry;
- one entry per person;
- due date is the May Guild meeting on May 12; goal is for voting/ display at the June meeting.
 Most importantly, have fun!

Block of the Month for May 2022 Twinkle Star


12" x 12" Block (12.5" x 12.5" unfinished)

Make this block out of yellow and two shades of blue.



Cutting

- Cut 6 light blue 3 ⁷/₈" squares
- Cut 6 dark blue 3 ⁷/₈" squares
- Cut 4 yellow 3 1/8" squares



Assembly

- 1. You are making 16 half square triangles (HST). Basic directions for HST: Put right sides together, draw a diagonal line on the light color and sew ¼" on each side of the line. Cut on the line. 2 HST made.
- 2. Make 4 light blue with dark blue. This will make 8 HST.
- 3. Make 2 light blue with yellow. This will make 4 HST.
- 4. Put 2 dark blue with yellow. This will make 4 HST.
- 5. Sew these together in rows following the picture.

The June block will be my last block. We need a person to take over BOM. I will be glad to help you.

Harvest Of Colors Quilt Judging

September 12, 2022, at St. Andrew's Church

The Judging Committee would like to encourage you to submit your quilt(s) to be judged in the Quilt Show. This is a great opportunity to receive an unbiased written evaluation of your quilt(s). The judge will give you positive comments as well as one or two suggestions for improvement. You will receive a personal, confidential, written critique after the show on Sunday.

We are happy to have Christine Brown as our judge this year. Chris is a long-time quilter and a well known NQA certified quilt judge. Quilt entry forms will soon be available on our website. This year there is not a separate form for Judging. There will be limits of two judged quilts per person and a total of 80 judged quilts.

To have pieces judged:

- complete the quilt entry form;
- attach a 4x6" photo of each piece;
- pay a \$25.00 fee for each quilt to be judged;
- choose a category for your quilt: traditional, modern, art or innovative/ contemporary. (Category definitions will be on the back of the form.)



The Judging Day is a fun, very busy day and we need all the help we can get! Please think about volunteering to assist on this day. Just send me a note telling me you want to volunteer. Pick a category that works for you! Any specific questions regarding the tasks involved, please feel free to contact me. Thanks so much!
