





Upcoming Workshops

In August, our very own Nancy Butterfield will teach introductory Sashiko stitching. Nancy is enthusiastic about Sashiko and will help you learn the techniques. This is a two-part workshop and on Friday, August 15th Nancy will help us to understand this ancient art and we will practice the Sashiko stitches.

A week later on Saturday, August 23rd we will make a Japanese rice bag. The bag is the perfect size to use as a project bag or lunch tote. You can make the bag with Sashiko stitching, your orphan blocks or just your favorite fabrics. You can line the bag with pockets and even make it reversible if you wish. The minimal cost of \$50.00 will enroll you in both sessions. This workshop is limited to 16 people. Come to one session or both but once enrolled, the spot is yours and CANNOT be sold to another person.





In September, Stacy Murray from Old Town Quilt Shop will hold a two-day mini retreat in Orcutt where we will be making our own special sneakers. These sneakers will only be limited by your imagination. You can make them as simple or as far-out as you like. You can spend the night in Orcutt or drive back and forth with friends. BUT . . . you must commit soon because Stacy has to order the kits. The cost of the workshop is \$55.00 and there is a \$60.00 charge for the kit. Community Projects

The incoming Community Projects team of Nancy LaRoche-Blau, Michelle Garbarino, Sue Gierhart and Barbara LaPlante met to plan for the upcoming year. Their meeting consisted of assessing the needs of the charities that we support and to set priorities for where we should direct our quilt-making efforts.

For the immediate term, we need fidget quilts. Oak Cottage, Maravilla, Visiting Nurse and Hospice, as well as Cottage Hospital Rehab Center have all requested them. The Running Stitches Satellite Group is working to supply more than 25 fidget guilts. However, we will need many more to fill this ever-growing need in our community. "Fidget supplies" such as lace, beads, hair scrunchies, key rings etc. will be brought to the July picnic meeting. If you want to make a small quilt top but leave the embellishing to others, we will gladly receive your guilt, and find someone to finish it. Some use the "quilt as you go" technique to embed the fidgets into the seams. However you envision producing one of these guilts, please know that it will fill an important need.

Other ongoing requests are for children's and baby quilts, wheelchair lap quilts and bed-sized quilts for children and adults. We do NOT need cradle quilts and kits, as we have enough inventory to fill the need for this holiday season. If you are away from Santa Barbara and want to send a quilt for Community Projects, it can be mailed to anyone on the Community Projects Team. Please wash any quilt other than a placemat or a fidget quilt, before you submit it for donation. Quilt labels have been restocked, and will be available at the Guild meetings or by contacting any one on our team.
