QUILT SHOW ETIQUETTE

Please do not touch the quilts or display items! Even if your hands look clean, your fingers transfer body oils, dirt and acids that could darken or weaken the textile fibers--and at a quilt show, each touch is multiplied many times. If you'd like to see the back of a quilt that has a clothespin clipped along the side, you may use the clothespin to pull the bottom up. If there is no clothespin, or if you have questions about any of the quilts, just ask one of the volunteers wearing white gloves for assistance or information.

No food or drinks are allowed in the display and vendor areas. Tables and chairs are outside in the front courtyard.

Please keep your children close, and often remind them to look and not touch. We appreciate your setting a good example.

Thank you for your help in preserving the quilts and the beauty of the displays.

Feel free to take as many pictures of the quilts as you like, but please do not photograph the vendors' displays or the boutique items. JUDGING

Some members submitted their quilts for evaluation by a National Quilting Association certified judge. Quilts were assessed according to overall impression as well as criteria such as technique, sashings and borders, embellishments, design, quilting stitch (front and back), edge treatment and use of color. Judging took place prior to the show, and ribbons have been placed on the winning quilts.

OPPORTUNITY QUILT RAFFLE

CHALLENGE QUILTS

Every year the Challenge Committee comes up with requirements around a theme and Guild members interpret those requirements using their creativity and skills to turn designs into reality. This year we are featuring Challenge quilts from the last four years; below are the main requirements for each:

2019 *Do Not Touch Signs*:

- Will be used to remind the public not to touch quilts at our Shows
- Make no political statements.
- Finished size must be 12" x 12".

2020 *Challenge: 3-T's*:

- Must include at least two different kinds of embellishments
- Must have a technique new to the member
- Must be a rectangle with a perimeter not more than 120"

2021 *The Great 2021 Scavenger Hunt: Must include at least 5 of items below*:

- Button, Flower, Star, Key, Eye, Feather, Bow, Vehicle, Light, Basket, Person, Tree, Bee, Flavor, Jewel, Money, Time, A Word, Bat, Wrench, Flag
- Bonus if ALL 21 are included.
- Any shape; no more than 120" around

2022 *Inspired by Suzy Kassem's Poem: Circles of Life*

- Three types of circles
- Cannot be square; maybe 3-dimensional; no more than 120" around
- Should include a recognizable amount of the color orange

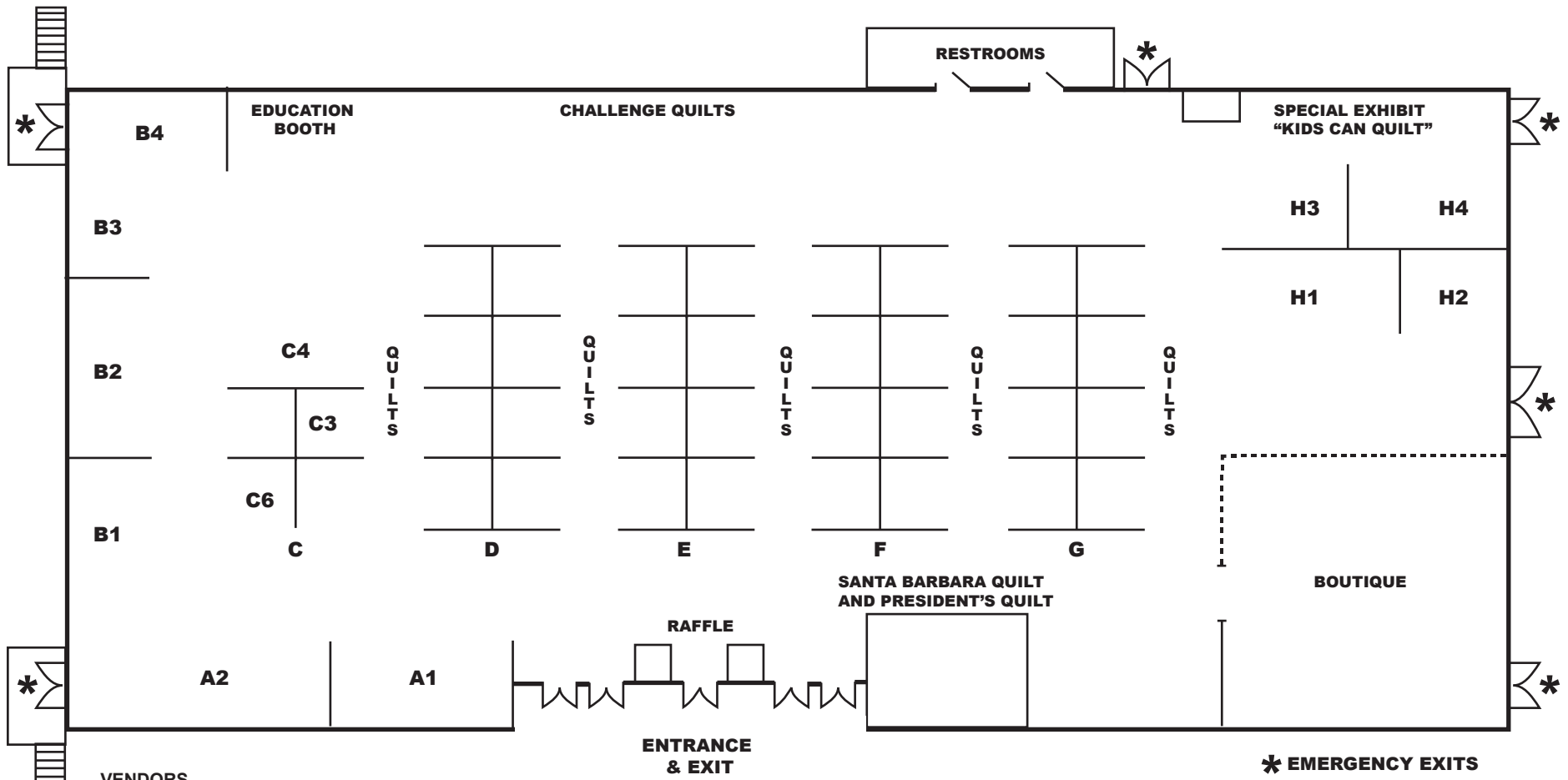

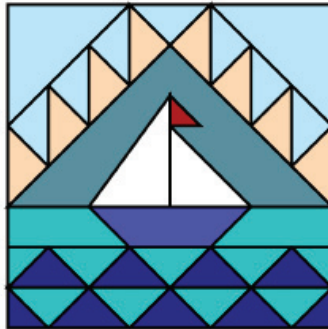


COASTAL QUILTERS GUILD OF SANTA BARBARA & GOLETA
