COASTAL QUILTERS MEETING MINUTES

MAY 10, 1989

Marty Frolli opened the meeting at 7:32 in the Goleta Library. There were 47 people present.

Suzy Carter introduced our guests, Kitty Kelly and Sukari Addison. Suzy and Bev Soderlund sold tickets to those still wanting to buy a chance in our \$-raffle.

Announcements were made:

- Janis Martin of the Civic Light Opera explained her group's need for help in making costumes for their June production of "42nd Street" and asked for volunteers.
- Jan Inouye, our program director, told us some of what's in store for us: June's Round Robin, July's Charlotte Eckback, and August's family picnic. Topics mentioned for the Round Robin were Olfa instructions, quilting stitches, templates and pattern-making, a Maggie Godwin to-be-announced specialty, an organizer table, shared xeroxed patterns, a Gingher-ordering table, and rampant socializing.
- Norah McMeeking, who is organizing the August picnic, presented options as to how the affair could be handled; we voted on these matters and determined that families should be included, that it should happen on our regular Wednesday night, that Stow Park should be our first choice spot, and that it should be a covered dish potluck.
- Carolyn Nielsen, our Raffle Quilt organizer, passed pictures and information sheets about our Navajo quilt, so that we might have an easier time selling tickets. Tickets are due July 12.
- Our Community Projects chairperson, Violet Mencher, said that there is a box available for donated fabrics to help make Hospice quilts. After a Show & Tell of these quilts in June, they will be presented to the Hospice organization.
- Liz Steele has been in touch with Stow House about our annual July 4th there. She passed sign-up sheets so that people could indicate if they would be selling and/or quilting that day. Since she has to be out of town at that time, she asked for a volunteer to take over for her; there were no takers.
- Our librarian, Carol Boyce, told us that Judy Mathieson, last month's speaker, gave us a book, and that we now have a stencil cutter that can be signed out.
- Sandi Globus has put together a new guild activity, a quilting bee, that will happen several times a year at the Goleta Valley Community Center. People will be able to baste quilts, share books and information, photograph quilts, and possibly do other quilt-related activities. The first Bee will happen May 18 from 9:30 to 3:30.

Maggie Godwin conducted our Block of the Month raffle - 29 Teacups were turned in! They were won by Ellie Wright. Maggie gave us a mini-lesson about primary colors and quick-piecing, then introduced our block for June, Pinwheel.

The prizes won in our \$-raffle were the book, Taking the Math Out of Quiltmaking, and a 6 x 24 Omnigrid.

Our program for the evening was a delightful Show & Tell of the Uplands Night Owl Quilters' Ugly Fabric Challenge, presented by our newest member, Betty Cavalucci.
