COASTAL QUILTERS MEETING MINUTES

JULY 12, 1989

Marty Frolli opened the meeting at 7:40 p.m. in the Goleta Library. There were 55 people present.

Suzy Carter welcomed and introduced our guests and new members; Bev Soderlund showed our \$-raffle items for the evening, some magnetic needlecases.

Marty introduced Frances Zeigler, who is active with the Friends of the Goleta Library. Ms. Zeigler told us of the library's lack of funding and cited how cutbacks might make it impossible for us to continue meeting there. She then passed petition cards for us to sign that would be submitted to the Board of Supervisors, asking that funding to the library be increased.

Announcements were made:

- In September, we will again be decorating the library's display case; the theme will be "Baskets". Sign-up sheets were passed so that people could volunteer any basket-related items such as quilts, pillows, books, knick-knacks, etc. On this committee are Maggie Godwin, Sandi Globus, Colleen Ozab, Marty Frolli, and Zetta Hanna.
- Zetta Hanna said that the Ginger order is in and thanked Sheila for handling it at the last meeting. There were 38 orders, totaling over \$1000! She also informed us that the next raffle quilt would soon be at her house, available for quilting, and passed sign-up sheets so we could pick a time to do the two blocks expected from each of us.
- Marty explained that at the Camarillo Quilters' July meeting it was obvious how much having a microphone enhanced their meeting; she says we'll again be looking into getting one for our guild.
- Jan Inouye of the Program committee explained our Childhood Memories Challenge to those who had not yet heard and told of this evening's related raffle, in which those participating in the Challenge each brought a 6-inch square of a fabric used in their quilt. The squares were all put in a basket that would be raffled later in the evening. She also told us of the upcoming workshops, Lucy Hilty's "Fine Quilting" in September and Elinor Peace Bailey's "Victorian Doll" in October; there are still spaces available in both classes but they need to be paid for as soon as possible.
- Colleen Ozab, who has taken over the handling of our August picnic, reminded us that this will take place on our regular guild night but will be held at Stow Park instead of at the library. She reminded us to bring our own drinks and tableware as well as our assigned food for six. There will be games and kid activities planned, but any volunteered equipment would be appreciated.

The \$-items, the magnetic needle cases, were raffled off and won by Aurora Gonzalez and Dundie Schulte.

Maggie Godwin gave us our Block of the Month mini-lesson, which she called Quilting 101. The block, Rag Dolls, was submitted by Diane Bartel; because of the picnic next month, these should be brought to the September meeting. The seventeen blocks of Old Maid's Puzzle were won, yet again, by Marge Hall.

We had a speedy Show & Tell.

Ellie Wright conducted the raffle for our Navajo comforter, which was won by Pat Carnes of Vandenburg AFB.

Jan held the raffle for the 6-inch squares, which was won by Sandi Globus.

Jan then introduced our speaker for the evening, Charlotte Ekback. Charlotte's lecture, "Scrap Quilts and Friends", was an overflowing trunk show of antique scrap quilts, spiced with bits and pieces of quilters' trivia.

Our next meeting will be on August 9, our First Annual Coastal Quilters' Family Picnic.
