Carol began the meeting by announcing that a book sale was to be held at the Goleta Library on November 10th to benefit the library.

Jan encouraged all to attend the "Wrapped in Glory" exhibit at The L.A. County Museum put together by Sandi Fox and on display through the end of ~~November~~. The museum is closed on Mondays.

Jan passed around the new Hoffman challenge fabric which is part of the Painted Desert collection #4511 in Burgundy. The quilts accepted for the challenge can be no more than 160 inches all around. The rules will be posted for all members. Harriet Berk won a prize in the 1990 challenge and will have her quilt join the national tour. Sandi attended the Simi Valley Quilt show and obtained some ideas for our own quilt auction. She located an auctioneer who is willing to come from Fullerton for the Museum auction. Small quilts only will be auctioned. The size is 36 x 36 or a maximum of 140 inches all around. The auction quilts are due by April 15th. The proceeds of each quilt will be 40% to the quilter, 30% to the Guild and 30% to the Museum Auxilliary.

Sandi also mentioned that several <sup>Barons</sup> quilt shops in Camarillo will give a 10% discount to our Guild emmbers. Discussion followed about inserting the business cards of the Quilt shops in the newsletter. It would be on a space available basis. It could also be included on the roster.

Maggie passed copiss of the Block of the Month called presents. There will also be a Grand Prize Drawing for those who participated each month in the block drawing. — when?
