- II. Carol Meyer from Grant House spoke about Creative Sewing Seminar on Thursday, February 9 at Grant House (see February newsletter).
- III. Lee Carlson reported on upcoming Quilt show. There are 52 paid entries. New committee Secretary is Chris Bollenbach; new Special Events Chairperson is Evelyn Gorrindo. Inquiry was made about finding the docent sashes previously used in 1991. 2x2x2 quilts are due by March 8. All quilts must have an entry form.
- IV. Anne Braddock reported that Libby Lehman's March workshop is filled and she has a waiting list started. 130 quilts were photographed at recent session; Anne may arrange another photo shoot if needed.
- V. Ruth Walters reported that 1995 Challenge will be focusing on yellow/orange. See rules and prize categories in February newsletter. Due date is in October (8 months from now!).
- VI. Lynn Laughrin gave thank you to Valentine's quilts brought tonight. She explained how Round Robin will work tonight. She also explained silent auction and quilter's bazaar for April meeting (see attached).

- VIII. Norah McMeeking explained promoting the Quilt show by members wearing quilt buttons "Ask me about my QUILT SHOW" and using quiz sheet. If entering a 2x2x2, members need entry form and label, due at next month's meeting.

Jan will demonstrate how to use Solvy stabilizer to achieve special sewing machine effects. Here is texture for appliqué and wearable arts!

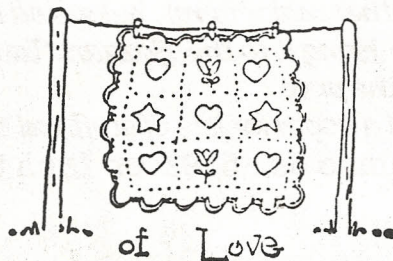
Miniatures: Phyllis Peterson

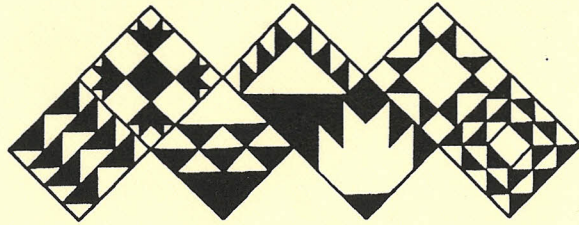
