1. Maggie Godwin opened the meeting at 7:30 pm.
2. Kristen Otte welcomed 4 new members and thanked the greeters, June Brandon, Oleta Bennett, and Cecilia Puppo.
3. Jan Inouye announced that the black and white challenge fabric for October's Wearable Art Challenge is available at Betty's and Beverly's, Goleta.
4. Kathy Doughty said that BB's Knits donated skeins of yarn which were sold to Guild members before the meeting. Proceeds will go to the Guild.
5. Susan Cochran who is chairing the Satellite Groups Committee encouraged members to sign-up and passed around sign-up slips.
6. Marty Frolli said that the new quarter for Adult Education classes begins this week.
7. Diane Eardley spoke about Community Project Quilts which will be donated to Sarah House, a group home and treatment facility for women and men who are HIV+. Quilts will be given to Sarah House throughout the year as they are finished by individual members. Diane also spoke about name tags which can be machine-embroidered at Grant House for no charge. Album blocks which are suitable for name tags are published in the March issue of *Quilters Newsletter Magazine*.
8. Sue Scholl said some "lost" books have been turned into the library. She described an incentive program in which members who do not have overdue books for the whole year will be eligible for a drawing for a magazine subscription.
