- Participants in the 1998 Guild Challenge were encouraged to find inspiration in a book title, famous quotation, poem or family saying.
- To use ten items on the surface of the quilt representing the Guild's 10th Anniversary.
- Quilters were also encouraged to take their inspiration out to the edges of their quilts...to use borders as part of the design.
- Optional category: inclusion of words on letters on the surface of the quilt--for those who like to practice methods of surface design.

The 1998 Guild Challenge brought unexpected surprises. Many of the artists added personal challenges such as trying a new technique for the first time. We were pleased to see such a variety of sewing techniques.

Challenge entries represent a Guild membership excited by the art form of quilting! It is a membership that continues to add to its knowledge and ability to express inspiration in a fabric medium.
