Quilt Show: Liz Turner asked for a show of hands of those working on quilts for the show and encouraged everyone to participate.

Pat Masterson spoke about the opportunity to have the members' quilts judged at the show and gave several examples of the judge's remarks.

Cathy Rose, the publicity chairperson, spoke about web sites for publicizing the show and asked anyone with knowledge of any to meet with her. The Library will have a display case available for us in September. Bookmarks are available; members are needed to take them to various areas. Judy Rys is completing on the poster and the newspaper ad. Contact people at KEYT and the News Press are needed.

Evelyn Gorrindo, boutique chairperson, encouraged members to make articles for sale. Fifteen percent of the price goes to Coastal Quilters which in turn pays for the booth. Anyone selling items must work for two hours both Saturday and Sunday—or provide someone to work for them. All items must be of good quality. Knitted items, jewelry, etc. may be sold. Block of the Month: Darilyn Kisch, from Sew It All satellite group, presented the pattern of the month and announced that past patterns are available as well as fusing techniques. The pattern in the newsletter needs to be increased to 8"; full-sized patterns are available on the back table.
