Community Quilts: JoAnn Dovgin urged members to turn in their Community Quilts. The quilts for "Angels Bearing Gifts" will be presented at the November meeting, and the ones for the Linus Project in December. The Linus Project quilts should have no ornamentation or embellishments that would be harmful to a child; all quilts should be washed and dried and free of any scent.

Show and Tell: Quilts were shown by: Mellissa Frolli, a Hawaiian applique in pink and white; Kristin Otte, a finish-it-up; Patti Hunter, three Community Quilts; Arla Wardell, "There's a Dog on My Quilt:" Barbara Ortiz, a UFO Challenge; and Carol Boyce, an antique pink and white quilt that is for sale.

Workshops: Janet Berlin announced the following upcoming programs and workshops:

- 1. In October, Cathy van Bruggen will teach "All About Applique," on Oct 13th. There is a \$35.00 fee for the workshop and \$10.00 for the pattern for a 24" x 24" piece.
- 2. In November, Eileen Alber, the owner of the Quilter's Studio in Newberry Park, will present a trunk show on Thursday night called "From Traditional to Contemporary," and on November 10th lead a workshop featuring a no-sew background, embroidery, and stenciling with paint. The workshop will require only simple supplies.
- 3. In December, Guild member Kim Wulfert will present her lecture "Quizzing the Quilt Historian," and members are asked to bring their vintage and antique quilts to the meeting to share. There will be no workshop

Announcements: Betty announced that the Board will meet next Thursday night in the Clubhouse at Maravilla. 2006 Quilt Show: Evelyn Gorrindo listed jackets, place mats, wallets, pin cushions, and wall hangings as items that will be for sale in the Boutique, and announced that there will be a meeting Friday Oct. 29th at 3 pm for all participants. Kathy Rose listed all the publicity that has been arranged for the show, thanked the people taking bookmarks and posters everywhere, and thanked Jean McMillan and Judy Rose for the poster and ad designs. Jean was also responsible for the display at the main library. Leslie Hogan expects to do the floor layout on Wednesday at a time T. B. D. Betty Kelley said that the distribution procedure for the guilts after the show has to do

with protecting the quilts. All first choice quilts are in; most of the second choices are in, based on size and color.
