Show and Tell

- Nola Ferguson tell: A Carpinteria corporation, Bega Lighting used to decorate the whole complex with antique quilts brought from back East. The son of the owner has donated the quilts to the Art Center and the ladies at the Carpinteria Presbyterian Church. They were made between 1895 and 1934 and are of very high quality. They will be available for sale May 31 and June 1 at the Carpinteria Historical Museum (across from Roxane's) and the church (on Carpinteria Ave behind Rusty's Pizza).
- Ranell Hansen tell: Ranell is in charge of the museum sale and has seen most of the quilts. They are all hand quilted and have various degrees of wear. In conjunction with the sale there will be a fiber arts show which will include all types of works—knitted, baskets, fiber jewelry, etc. Ranell has flyers with the entry information. Please email her with a photo of your entry. There is space for up to 70 quilts. The size limit is 40 x 40 but larger quilts will be accepted. ALL pieces will be up for sale.
