Announcements—Carol Fay

Two board positions remain open, Public Affairs and Refreshments. The Public Affairs chair does occasional writing, preparing news blurbs and notifications. The Refreshments chair puts out the water, arranges the donated snacks, and designates the groups assigned to bring snacks. Either job can be done with the assistance of a satellite group or friend.

Workshops—Margaret Dear/Pam Holst/Penny Valentine

- The September workshop is with Jennifer Sampou, a designer of both fabric (Kaufman) and quilt patterns (whale, elephant). Her project incorporates 35" blocks; she provides the pattern for \$11. Any colors can be used. She has hints on an easy way to do multiple points and flying geese.
- The workshop in October is with Linda Ballard. She is a very good teacher and provides excellent instruction manuals. Darilyn and Barbara showed quilts they had made from one of her workshops.
