Coastal Quilters Guild Meeting Minutes February 13, 2020

The meeting was called to order by President Karen Pickford at 7:02 PM.

A. Up and Coming Meeting Dates—Karen Pickford

- The next Board meeting is Thursday, February 20 at 6:30 at Maravilla. A main topic of discussion will be the update to the guild bylaws. All guild members are welcome to attend.
- Announcement: A reminder to everyone to pick up their tickets for the Opportunity Quilt. If requested, the ticket packets can be delivered to satellite meetings for members who are not able to pick them up at the general meeting. Since this is our big fund-raiser for this year, we need to sell all the tickets.

B. Committee Reports

- There are still openings for the “Whimsey Wedges” March workshop with Pam Hadfield. She began her sewing career designing clothing for children and then moved on to quilting. She is currently teaching beginning quilting at Saddleback College.

 - Quilts which require special handling can either be rolled on a foam "noodle" and put in a pillowcase or enclosed in a hard-sided case, such as a cardboard folder.
