Monks in Irish monasteries created this illumination of the Gospels on vellum, made of sheepskin or calf. Limited colors were available - predominately bright yellow, red and greenmade from powdered minerals mixed with a binding agent of vinegar or egg.

Her talk this evening, "Clothing for the Body and Soul" features original or near original designs by this remarkable folk artist. This fashion show presents an unexpected visually exciting look at Art-to-wear. More than two dozen garments will be featured, covering a wide variety of styles, from casual to elegant, and a witty, personal and sometimes poignant commentary by Rachel. A special treat for all of us will be seeing members of Coastal Quilters modeling these one-of-a-king clothing "statements." Get ready for a visual feast!

This workshop with Rachel is designed to engage your interest and involve you in the exploration of clothing as art. An introductory lecture will stimulate the development of new ideas. Gifted quilter Judy Mathieson of Woodland Hills is paying a return visit to Coastal Quilters in May, when her talk will feature "Pieced Patchwork Pictures." Judy's recent work is featured in Quilters Newsletter No. 234. Judy uses a postage stamp technique to lay a grid over a picture to translate the shapes and colors into squares or triangles to create a pieced picture. Some of us have seen Judy's and Judy's students pet portrait quilts in many area quilt shows. Judy has expanded on her technique to use almost any close-up image, such as pets, flowers, and even people. A workshop on the same theme will take place on Thursday following the Guild meeting. as your ribbon colors


*use bright, "Easter Egg" colors

*final block is 7 1/2" by 7 1/2" without seam allowance, 1/4" seam allowances throughout.


*These blocks set together in a number of interesting ways, and will be great fun to play with if you win!
