
Onwards and Upwards ... to new heights with our Opportunity Quilt!!

July - Rainbow Pinwheel

- * Pick a rainbow color. You will need a dark, medium, and light fabric in the chosen color.
- * While you can piece each diamond separately (I DON'T recommend it!), the easiest way to piece this is to sew together three 1 1/4" wide strips, each about 1 yard long, and then use the diamond template to cut eight striped diamonds.
- * Use a white-on-white fabric for the background.
- * When your done, (unless your piecing was perfect! Mine never is...) sew a cute button in the center to act as the pinhead.
- * Final block is 11 X 11, without seam allowances.










