

*Our Show and Tell gives us a chance to share our own accomplishments and to see what others have done.


*We have a drawing for door prizes of quilt-related items such as books, patterns, and supplies.

Tomorrow


There will be a one day workshop on color evaluation tomorrow, for making colorwash quilts. Contact Jan Inouye, workshop chairperson to join the fun!


January -- Nine Patch & Hearts

— If you win these blocks, you'll have four whole days until Valentine's Day to finish your quilt! -




Construction:

1. Cut the large (5") square from black solid fabric.

Cut 4 small (2") squares of solid black.

Cut 5 small (2") squares and the heart from at least five solid colored fabrics (pastels thru clear mediums -- blues, greens, purples or pinks)

- 2. Sew the nine small squares together into a nine-patch block. Use a 1/4" seam allowance. Measure after the first seam. If it isn't 1/4" -- try again. Complete the nine-patch.
- 3. Press the nine-patch. Compare it to the large black square. Are they the same size? If not, make adjustments to the pieced block.



4. Hand appliqué heart on black square. Press.

Are both blocks still the same size?

5" Cut from black solid fabric heart does not include seam allowance

Beverly Dunivent speaks on the cultural history of scrap quilts.


