Ouilts at the Museum of Natura History" . . .:

In May of 1991 the Guild and the Museum League held a 3-day juried quilt show to benefit the Museum of Natural History and the Guild. The show took place at the museum and included invitational quilts by well-known quilters, antique quilts, and a group of our member's challenge quilts. At the same time we gave the museum a 75th anniversary quilt and held an auction of small quilts. The seed money for the events was provided by the Museum League and, as a League project, the Guild was covered by the museum's insurance policy. We had free use of their auditorium for set-up and the exhibit, use of museum facilities for planning and jurying meetings, and the help of museum staff members. The exhibit was beautifully presented, staffed by knowledgeable Guild docents, and enthusiastically received by the thousands who attended it. The Museum League used most of their part of the proceeds to buy a display case for the 75th anniversary quilt. The quilt is on exhibit in Fleischmann Auditorium.

### **Block Contest**





All quilters are invited to participate in a block contest sponsored by The Robert Kaufman Fabric Company and the Los Angeles County Fair. There will be three categories, pieced, appliqué, and mixed media with four winners in each category. The 1st prize winner will receive \$75 with \$50 for 2nd place, \$25 for 3rd, and a rosette ribbon awarded to 4th place. The overall Best of Show winner will receive \$100. The blocks will be judged at the LA County Fair and the winning blocks will be displayed by The Robert Kaufman Fabric Company at the Houston Quilt Market in October 1993.

To enter the contest you must purchase a fabric kit for \$3. Kits may be purchased at The Fabric Patch in Montclair, CA, Luella's Quilt Basket in Manhattan Beach, CA, and Quilters Haven in Upland, CA. Kits may also be ordered by mail from the Los Angeles County Fair, Home Arts Division, PO Box 2250, Pomona, CA 91769. If ordering kits by mail please make your check payable to the Los Angeles County Fair and include a \$1.75 shipping and handling charge. Kits will be available starting May 1, 1993.



South Sea Imports, in conjunction with Road to California, is sponsoring "Creative Fashions for Real People," a wearable arts contest. The focus of this contest is on garments which quilters from all walks of life can be comfortable wearing for work and play. There will be a fashion show featuring the top thirty garments at The Ontario Marriott Hotel in Ontario, CA on Saturday, October 9, 1993.

The garments may include plain and fancy threads, batting, buttons, baubles, beads, etc. Garment construction and embellishments can employ both hand and machine sewing and quilting techniques. 





Coastal Quilters Guild March Block of the Month



Fabrics: 100% cotton


This "block" is actually two different blocks sewn together.


To achieve the "chain" effect, make sure that the fabrics you use clearly contrast one with another.

Medium to dark green print.
 (Predominantly clear green, without other colors in the print.
 For Block 1 cut 12 A's. For Block 2 cut 4 A's and 4 C's.

2. Light to medium green print. (Predominantly green.) For Block 1 cut 9 A's.

3. Unbleached muslin OR white-on-white print OR very pale beige print. For Block 1 cut 4 A's. For Block 2 cut 4 B's and 4 D's.






(Unfinished 10-1/2" x 10-1/2")



- 1. Arrange all those A's.
- 2. Sew pairs together. Press towards darker fabric.



3. Sew the green/green pairs together, forming 4-patches. Press.



4. Sew light/green pairs to four patch units. Press.




5. Sew light/green pairs to center square to form center row. Press.



6. Sew four patch units to center row to form block. Press.

**CONSTRUCTION: Block 2** 

(Unfinished 10-1/2" x 10-1/2".)



1. Arrange C's & D's to form a square. Sew each C to a D. Press towards darker fabric. Sew one CD unit to another. Press towards darker fabric. Sew units together to form a square. Press.










2. Sew 2 A's to a B. Make two units. Press towards darker tabric.



3. Sew two B's to square formed in #1. Press towards square.



4. Sew two AB units to unit formed in #3. Press seam away from center.

FINISHING: Sew Block 1 to Block 2. Press toward Block 1. 10-1/2" x 20-1/2" unfinished.
