Luminous Japanese Quilter Setsuko Segawa Visits in June

Working in luxurious fabrics such as kimono silks and brocades, Setsuko Segawa produces quilts that are unique, beautiful interpretations of flowers, landscape, and birdlife. Definitely Asian in sensibility, her works have been published in numerous books and periodicals such as Quilt Art Japan and The New Wave Quilt. Setsuko has also organized exhibits of American quilts which have toured extensively in Japan.

Setsuko uses a variety of techniques to produce her original quilts, but most include lots of applique. Large areas of background space are skillfully quilted in patterns that add atmosphere, dimensionality, and movement to accent the main design. Sometimes she quilts the entire background before adding color with an airbrush. Then she appliques the foreground design.

A woman of boundless energy, Setsuko Segawa is highly regarded on both sides of the Pacific and has done much to bring American and Japanese quilters to each other's attention.

Applique Workshop with Setsuko Segawa

On Thursday, June 10, Setsuko will teach a 5-hour workshop on applique at the Goleta Community Center. We will work with Setsuko's noshi design. Noshi are traditional Japanese good luck talismans and are often depicted in quilts. They are attached to gifts given on important occasions. Essentially a bundle of long strips, noshi are tied with knots which have special spiritual power in Asian tradition—uniting lovers and protecting an area from harm. Noshi are often used today on the elaborate bridal robe for the traditional Japanese wedding ensemble.

Workshop participants will learn applique techniques and make a small piece that can be used as the center of a quilt, part of a garment, or a handbag or tote bag.

This is a great program to bring your non-quilting friends to and one that <u>men</u> especially enjoy. Rob might enjoy the company!


Margaret will be autographing and selling her recently published book, <u>Christmas Traditions</u> from the Heart.




"SLAP-DASH" LOG CABIN

or "fractured log cabin" or "free-form log cabin"


This is a block to have fun with! You'll notice there is not pattern given - just a few brief guidelines:


- 1. Use solid colored fabrics in clear colors (not greyed). Use medium lights, mediums, or medium darks (no darks, no lights).
- 2. Start with an angular shape of three ormore sides (3, 4 or 5 will probably work best) of between 1 and 2 inches in size.
- 3. Working in the log cabin manner, add strips of various solid colored fabrics to the sides of the shape. These "logs" can be any size or shape.
- 4. Continue to add "logs", working clockwise around the shape you started with. (If you lose track of which "log" you applied last, sew the newest "log" to the side with two seams).
- 5. Add a total of AT LEAST nine "logs".

 Continue until your block is at least large enough to extend beyond the edges of an eight inch square.




Roberta Horton described the process in Plaids & Stripes: The Use of Directional Fabric in Quilts (page 58, 1990. Berkeley, Ca.) - "I cut the logs freehand. I also started with a shape other than a square for the center. The resulting ...(blocks) didn't need to be the same size or shape. How the units were ultimately joined with each other was a problem to be dealt with later."





"Rotary Riot" by Hopkins is wonderful for techniques & fast methods.


"Small Talk" by Thomas is also wonderful for learning techniques.
