Angrice Beigne won the hand blocks! Embellished surfaces will be the topic of tonight's lecture from noted "wearables" artist Christen Brown. Using both hand and sewing machine, this versatile designer brings color, depth, and texture to the surfaces of her garments while creating moods that range from the pensive to the festive.

Christen describes herself as a "major hoarder" of fabric, buttons, beads and baubles. An experienced designer but new to teaching, she has found unexpected fulfillment acting as a guide to her students. Her intention is to create garments that will "create a fantasy-like aura to envelop the wearer of each of my garments." Wearable art holds Christen's interest because of the infinite directions this field allows her imagination to travel.







Coastal Quilters Guild September Block of the Month Maggie Godwin 964-7954



Fabrics:

100% cotton, prewashed.

Candy corn:

Prints or solids of white, orange, and yellow.

Background:

Print or solid black.

Cutting:


A "strip" equals a piece of fabric cut cross grain from selvage to selvage.

1. Cut one 1-1/2" strip of white and one 1-1/2" strip of yellow.

2. Cut one 2" strip of orange.


3. Cut 4" strip of black.






Construction:


1. Sew strips of white and yellow to each side of the orange strip.



Using template "A" cut out "corns". You need four corns per block.
Use lines on template to line up correctly.
Note this is a one-way template. Do not flip over.



3. Using template "B/Br" cut out the background pieces from the black strip. You need four "B's" and four "Br's" per block.





4. Sew a "B" and a "Br" to each side of an "A". This unit should measure 4".




5. Sew four units together to form block. See diagram for correct placement. Block should measure 7-1/2" unfinished.
