Dear Coastal Quilters,

Today I was reading through my beautiful (Thank you so <u>very much</u> to my "old board members!) Kaffee Fassett book, <u>Glorious Quilts</u>, and thinking "this is not one I'm going to put in the Silent Auction next month." But I do have a few contributions to make—some equally wonderful duplicate books that my relatives on the east coast have sent me (they've never been able to see just how many quilting books I own!) There's nothing quite like a quilt book "classic"—almost as much fun as a classic quilt!

The Silent Auction is great fun, provides you with more storage space at home, offers bargains galore, and raises money for the Guild too. Carolyn Neilsen, known to many of you from her years of local teaching, has generously donated her "stash" of quilting fabric—especially solids (and they never go out of style!)— books, magazines and other goodies, so this year's auction promises to be especially interesting. Our teachers are nationally and even internationally known, and it is great to be able to study with them without the expense of attending a big conference. We are working on bringing you some Saturday workshops in the future too.

Every year we receive letters from museums, quilt history organizations, and quiltrelated projects asking for our financial support. Perhaps it is time for CQG to make a significant donation to one of these worthy causes. Our "Harvest of Colors" members' showcase in October will clearly be the highlight of our year. I hope <u>every</u> member is preparing a quilt for the show. Along with those breathtaking masterpieces, we want to show the wonderful scope of quiltmaking today and honor its traditions of community, nurturing, and sharing. There's something especially exciting about "first quilt" on a label, and I hope we'll have some. It would be just great if people left our event eager to learn to quilt themselves.

What is a Silent Auction?

Every item in the auction has a bid sheet attached. You can see the price being offered and raise it if you want to by adding your name and the higher bid. Then someone else can come and outbid you. But! You are keeping an eye on things and can raise your bid! And so on until "time" is called. Pay for the items you "win" and take them home.

Who Gets the Money?

This is a fun(d)-raiser for the Guild. The money is used to defray our operating expenses. (If you have a big ticket quilt item for sale, every member can place one free "ad" in our newsletter per year.) What Can I Donate to the Auction? As we like to say, "one woman's trash is another's treasure" so almost any donation is welcome! (We discourage donating anything alive). Unfinished projects, your stash of scraps, clothing patterns you've completed, notions you didn't take a shine to, quilting hoops, notecards, books, magazines, out of date calendars, books on tape (to listen to while you sew) and even bean soup mix (why cook when you can sew?) Anything you bought, kept, ect. Would probably be tempting to another quilter.

- We'll need helpers early on to attach bid sheets to items and sharpen pencils ect. If you can handle tape deftly, we can use you.

How Can I Help at the Auction?

- We need cashiers to total up "bills" and take money. If you have a good head for figures or a reliable calculator we can use you.
- We need "runners" to gather and sort things out after the bidding is over.

Have you ever dreamt of a garden with no weeds...flowers that bloom forever....a lawn that is green and carefree?


Well, here it is!

GUILD QUILT SHOW

There has been comment and discussion among members for the Guild to consider doing a members show. As there is no chairman at this time volunteers will be needed. A possible time frame was discussed and on the basis of her experience with the "Natural Impressions" shows Norah felt that a show could be done as early as the fall and a huge committee would not be needed. By keeping things simple an opportunity could be provided for all members to exhibit their work. Some sites mentioned were:

- 1. Fleishman Auditorium at the Natural History Museum is available. We could work directly with the Museum to simplify matters.
- 2. Carillo Arts Center seems to be expensive. Thought to be \$1100/weekend day and \$900 / weekday.
- 3. Golita Community Center is \$150 for the auditorium and \$50/ room. There would be good vender space.
 - 4. Antioch College. (A visit later eliminated this as there is not adequate space.)
 - 5. Earl Warren Betty Kelley will call re costs.

Diana Reese has spoken to Norah re curating an antique quilt show and this might offer a possibility in conjunction with a member show.

INSURANCE - Kathy and Norah will pursue what our liability coverage is at both general meetings and workshops as we do not know what Samarkand and Goleta might provide.

Coastal Quilters' Guild 10th Anniversary Member Challenge

"SEW They say...."

Theme: Famous Quotation or Book Title

Size: 25' x 25' or smaller

Due: September 9, 1998 Guild Meeting

Create a wall hanging that illustrates a famous quotation or book title. Your entry may be abstract or pictorial or both.

The complete `quotation & author' or ` book title & author' will appear on a display card next to your quilt. Quotes by the infamous "Anonymous" are acceptable. A quote by your Mother or Unde Albert are not acceptable unless they are famous. There will be awards for children's book titles too. We will view the entries and vote at the September 9th meeting. Entries will be displayed at our October quilt show.

Your Challenge:

- 1. Illustrate a famous quotation or book title. <u>Do not copy</u> another artist's work! Be creative in your own unique way.
- 2. Border/Binding: Take your creativity right out to the binding...
 We want to see really creative borders and/or bindings on your wall hanging.
- 3. In honor of our 10th Anniversary, you may incorporate ten of something, for example, 10 patchwork pieces, 10 applique pieces, 10 stripes, or 10 of anything you wish, as part of your surface design.

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Additional Category for the truly ambitious:

In addition to the above requirements, you may include the following optional item:

(THIS IS OPTIONAL!)

Incorporate words on the surface of your wall hanging. You may include the entire quotation, book title or telling phrase from the book or use a few words to suggest the quotation or title. Entries with this treatment will qualify for an additional category. There are many ways to do this....be creatively
