Expand your free motion machine quilting skills with techniques that will add textural richness to your quilts. She will include an extensive presentation of different types of battings, threads, needles, and much more. At this hands-on workshop you will learn the many types of machine quilting stitches straight lines, gentle curves, stippling, filler patterns for many designs, simple and complex, and isolated quilting motifs. This class is for "competent beginners" and you will need a machine that does zig-zag. You will use an open toe foot, darning foot, walking foot, and pintuck foot.

Vendors

As part of the council's commitment to the guilds, and the guilds commitment to it's Vendors we had two speakers. Kelly Gallagher-Abbott spoke on behalf of the Vendors and Wendy Price represented the guilds.

The Vendor Speaks

Kelly gave us a brief background of her company Jukebox. In the last 6 years there have been many changes in quilt shows, and other events that involve vendors:

Guilds should consider:

- ❖ The overall quilt market is still growing but the increase in sales has slowed dramatically.
- The number of guilds and the number of shows has increased.
- With all the expenses vendors may incur they need over 2500 visitors to a show to break even. This makes smaller shows not feasible though Kelly personally supports them.
- ❖ Decreasing the number of vendors at individual shows. It is tempting to increase the number of vendors, but this may cut the individual vendors profits in half!
- Decrease the frequency of their shows, every other year instead of every year.
- Decrease the overall number of shows by having joint shows
- ❖ Vendors need to be kept informed as much as possible about such things as, security issues, guild, fire and local requirements and even adjacent hotels.
- ❖ Food needs to available nearby, and vendors need to be allowed to have food in their booths. But visitors should never be allowed food or drinks in the show areas. This protects the quilts as well.
- ❖ Vendors who are alone may need a break, guilds need to have a few volunteers for this, although most vendors do not travel alone. If a vendor needs help a flag could be posted at the outer edge of the booth to alert the vendor chairperson.
- ❖ Try to encourage camaraderie among vendors rather then competition. Having a vendor break room, where they can get to know each other. Or have a morning coffee get together.
- ❖ A wider booth is better then a deep booth. Ex 14' wide and 10' deep better then 10' wide and 14' deep.
- More and longer show hours not always helpful to vendors.
- ❖ A map of vendor locations in the show program a is helpful.

- ❖ There should be notices in the program and some signs throughout the show stating no sketching or photography in the vendor booths. That is ok to photograph only the show display quilts, not vendor samples. Most vendor pattern and book samples are copyrighted, if you like a quilt, buy the pattern/book, to use as a reference.
- Let the vendors know how the show is going, attendance figures etc.
- Have a vendor survey at the end of the show

The Guild Point of View

The main goal of a guild show is as a fund raiser. The guilds request the following from vendors:

- Contracts need to be returned in a timely manner
- ❖ Deposit or full payment must be made in a timely manner. This helps the guilds who must pay in advance for facilities and other show expense
- Cancellation clause should be clear
- Fire/safety codes must be adhered to by all Vendors
- Displays should be attractive and easily accessible.
- Demonstrations of products always a good idea
- ❖ When selecting vendors guilds should request a booth photo and list of products they sell.
- ❖ A variety of different types of vendors help complement each other

Vendor Chairpersons

- ❖ The Vendor chairperon needs to be very organized
- ❖ Kelly said that Barbara McDowell from the Road To California and other shows is a good example. Barbara would be a good resource of information and ideas for being a good vendor chairperson.
- The Vendor Chairperson should be empowered by the guild to handle any problems that occur including disputes between vendors or safety issues on the spot.
- ❖ The Vendor chairperson should be available to the vendors.
- ❖ Kennalee Matson complied a list of current vendors for the guilds. This was given to the reps to give to their show chairman or show vendor chair. Thank you Kennalee what a great reference

Guilds and Vendors must work together to achieve their goals, to make money and have a great show.





"SEW They say..."



Theme: Create a wall hanging inspired by a quotation or book title.

New size:

36" x 36" or smaller

(or any configuration no larger than 144" in circumference.

Due:

September 9, 1998 Guild Meeting private showing, voting

Public display: October Guild Quilt Show

Source quotation & author or book title & author will appear on a display card next to your quilt. Anonymous quotes are also acceptable... even a quote by your Mother! Yes, your entry may be abstract, pictorial, or both.

Your Challenge:

1. The challenge is designed to give you and the viewer 'pause to think' about the words or literary title you have chosen as inspiration for your visual creativity. <u>Do not copy</u> another artist's drawings! The visual part of this challenge must be yours. Be creative in your own unique way. If you do not want to use a direct quotation or title, the entry may be "Inspired by..."

EXAMPLE: abstract or pictorial scene, "Inspired by: Alice in Wonderland by Louis Carroll"

- **2.** Border/Binding: Take your creativity right out to the binding...we want to see really creative borders and/or bindings on your wall hanging...perhaps something you always wanted to try....here's your chance for a really different border... because imagination and creativity are unlimitled!
- **3.** In honor of our 10th Anniversary, incorporate TEN of something... 10 patchwork pieces, applique pieces, stripes, flower petals, polka dots, embellishments (10 of anything you wish) as part of your design.

Bonus Category for the truly ambitious:

You may include an optional technique: Use words on the surface of your wall hanging! Include the quotation itself (if it doesn't infringe on copyrights) or use a few words to "suggest" the quotation or title. Entries with this treatment will qualify for a special category.

There are many ways to add words....applique, shadow work, phototransfer, transfers using special iron-on computer papers, fabric pens, fabric paint or crayons, stenciling and of course fabric printed with alphabet letters in any language.
