Paula is the author of Kaleidoscopes & Quilts (C&T), travels extensively throughout the United States teaching her unique kaleidoscope quilt-

making techniques. She is a recipient of Artists' Fellowships from New York Foundation for the Arts (1995) and The Bronx Council on the Arts (1996). Serendipity, a line of fabric designed exclusively for Benartex, Inc. premiered in 1997.

Paula's award winning quilts have been featured in numerous international exhibits and television shows, including "CBS Sunday Morning", The Great American Quilt" (PBS) "New York Views" (ABC), "Handmade by Design" (Lifetime) and "Lazar's Bazaar" (CBS). Her quilts have also showcased on the covers of many, many magazines. Paula was particularly proud to be interviewed on two NPR affiliates WNYC (New York, NY) and KUAC (Fairbanks, Alaska). Her commissions include hangings for corporate spaces and a group of selected pieces which were offered through Liberty of London, Inc at Rockefeller Center.

BLOCK OF THE MONTH

TURKEY RED AND WHITE OHIO STAR

Dress up your holiday feast with blocks of TURKEY red. After you finish your block of the month - make some more for placemats...a table runner...the center of a Thanksgiving wreath.

Our Ohio Star will finish at 9 inches square.

FABRICS:Background - solid white please. For the star use a solid TURKEY red or a very small simple print in TURKEY red.

CUT:

4 - 3 1/2 inch white squares


1 - 3 1/2 inch TURKEY red square

Quarter Square Triangles - cut 4 1/4 inch squares - 2 white and 2 TURKEY; then cut each square diagonally from corner to corner twice to create 4 quarter square triangles from each square.

ASSEMBLE: As in diagram, sewing together row by row.

NOTE: All 4-patch squares should have a WHITE triangle bordering the center

TURKEY square!
