

## August Meeting!

Though I will miss the August Guild meeting and wonderful silent auction, Vice President Betty Kelley has agreed to preside in my absence. I'll see you all in September.



**AUCTION/SALE:** Gather fabric, notions, quilt related magazines, books, UFO's, vintage needlework, craft items, etc. Magazines, books and patterns will be sold at a flat rate. Everything else will be sold to the highest bidder in silent auction format. Package stuff in sellable units. Wrap, tie together, or put in clear plastic bags so we can easily see what it is. ## Trip Report

If this newsletter is late getting to you, it's my fault—we were on a wonderful vacation trip in our new VW campervan. I was busy planning our trip up to Portland via the inland route, and down via the coastal route, when what to my wondering eyes should appear, but an ad in the “Quilter’s Newsletter Magazine” for quilt shops along the Oregon coast! Ah, what a pity...

I couldn't quite make all of the shops—we went by either too early or too late, or on a day they were closed, but I gave it a good try, and I had some wonderful fun along the way.

(There were too many great things to illustrate in this newsletter, so I'll bring photos to the meeting next week.) First of all, we were checking out the Crater Lake Lodge (beautiful spot!!) and in the lobby was a magnificent quilt commemorating the Lodge's 100<sup>th</sup> anniversary. Then, in Portland, we toured the Japanese Gardens—and what should we find in the Pavilion but an exhibit called “High Fiber Diet” with wonderful Japanese-inspired textiles and fabrics by local crafts people and sewers.

Off to the coast, where quilting and quilt shops seem to be around every corner! We stopped first at the *Center Diamond* shop in Cannon Beach and then headed for our camp site at Nehalem Beach. We were sitting in our camp chairs, enjoying the view


when a huge motor home towing a VW Bug maneuvered its way into the spot across the way. I was intrigued because it appeared to be all women in the motor home, but then I spotted the license plates: WE QLT on the motor home and QLT BUG on the car! Thirty seconds later, I was chatting with Paula, Jackie, and Jan, three ladies from Roseville (near Sacramento) who travel around in the

motor home with four sewing machines and three cupboards full of material. When I finally gave up and went to bed, I could see their sewing lights glowing in the dark. When I woke up some time later – yup, they were still at it!

The next day, we sampled cheese at the Tillamook factory, and then tracked

down the *Latimer Textile and Quilt Center*, which was, unfortunately, closed on Mondays. But I couldn't resist taking this picture of the side building and the biggest quilt block I've ever seen. That's my husband standing in front of it, so you can see how big it is. Before we left town, I visited *Jane's Fabric Patch* and added to my stash of pine tree greens and yummy flannels.

The next quilt stop was in Port Orford and the *Quilter's Corner*. Chatted with other travelers who also had a list of shops they were visiting. Added to the stash and picked up a good block pattern of a lighthouse. The final stop was in Ferndale, California, at the *Itty Bitty Quilt Shop*. No bigger than my living room, it was full of

fun fabrics and accessories. We also checked out the *Ocean Quilts* shop in Mendocino. They had no fabric, but they did have some lovely local quilts for sale.

Since we were visiting friends in San Jose on the way home, I took the opportunity to visit the Quilt Museum there. They had a most interesting exhibit of large, full-size digital reproductions of quilt designs, with added photographs and stories by pioneer Jewish women. The artist who created the hangings also added bits of fabric and various buttons or beads to various parts of the designs. It was very interesting, and very different. ●

# BLOCK OF THE MONTH - SEPTEMBER

## SNAIL'S TRAIL


This traditional block is set together, straight or diagonally, matching dark and light corners to create the overall "snail trail" pattern. Use two fabrics, one light and one dark, in your choice of **autumn-color prints** (greens, browns, golds, rusts, reds).



**EASY PIECING - NO TEMPLATES.** To save time, layer dark and light fabrics together before cutting.

### FROM BOTH LIGHT AND DARK FABRICS, CUT PIECES:


- A: 2 squares, 2-1/4" x 2-1/4"
- B: 2 squares, 3-3/8" x 3-3/8"; then cut each square in half diagonally.
- C: 2 squares, 4-1/4" x 4-1/4"; then cut each square in half diagonally.
- D: 2 squares, 5-7/8" x 5-7/8"; then cut each square in half diagonally.




### TO ASSEMBLE:

See online <http://www.quiltlogic.com/SeptBOM.html>


1. Sew two **dark A's** to two **light A's**. Press toward dark squares.




2. Sew the two units together into a 4-patch.




3. Lay out 4-patch unit with dark square on top left, then sew on two **dark B's** as shown. Press, then add two **light B's**.



4. Lay out unit with dark triangle on top left, then sew on two **dark C's** as shown. Press, then add two **light C's**.




5. Lay out unit with dark triangle on top left, then sew on two **dark D's** as shown. Press, then add two **light D's**.



Your block should measure 10-1/2".
