

Nancy Halpern

Starting out 25 years ago as a traditional quilter, Nancy Halpern makes quilts that are almost instantly recognizable today. Her sense of color and design and her unique graphic qualities are all distinctive. Using a combination of planned out, carefully conceived design areas and free-form random elements, she strives to portray both substance and emotion in her work. With her bold geometry and subtle use of color, she helped open doors for all of us today. One of her quilts is included in the 100 Best of the Century.

Along the way, she has developed techniques such as tessellation and geometric manipulation to help free the quilter to express the thought behind the image. Her advice to all quilters is to "defy authority!" Her goal in teaching is to give others the tools to figure out how to say and do what they want to.

Anyone with an interest in learning how to expand their own "quilt vocabulary" will enjoy this presentation.

President's Message

When I was a young wife and teacher in St. Louis, Missouri, I spent lots of my free time searching out garage sales. In those days I had no children, little money, and was usually alone on weekends while my husband spent long hours at the hospital completing his surgical residency. (Can you say L-O-N-E-L-Y?) Actually, important life lessons were learned during those years. I got used to tackling problems on my own, learned to make most of what I wore, and mastered the art of bargain shopping.

Going to yard sales was perfect for someone in my situation. The activity required lots of time and very little money. I remember excitedly shopping for clothes for my first niece. I went to sales in the nicest neighborhoods and found expensive, littleworn baby clothes for pennies. I also bought dresses and skirts for myself and remade them to fit. Eventually, while expecting our son, I

bought maternity clothes, a bassinet and a slightly stained aqua baby snowsuit. Only occasionally did I buy fabric. And unfortunately, I never even thought to look for quilts.

I recently rediscovered the fun of garage sales and thrift shops. My son and daughter-in-law moved into their first house last month, so I began searching for odds and ends for them. Yesterday I bought a lawn mower for \$25, and last week I found a shovel and rake.

Of course, my search for 'odds and ends' has led to some incredible fabric finds. What a surprise! At a recent garage sale, advertised as a *quilter's paradise*, I claimed several bolts of plaid Indian cotton fabrics perfect for all sorts of quilts, as well as wonderful swatches of home decorator fabrics for art quilts and altered book projects. But the highlight of that day awaited me at a little estate sale near Cottage Hospital.

The entire contents of the little house were for sale. Items filled the front and back yards. The homeowners had lived in the same house for sixty-five years. By the looks of things, they hadn't discarded many of their be-longings in all of those years. Happily, the wife

had been a quilter. Oh, my goodness! I found fabric from my grandmother's era. There were also lovely florals from the 50s, wild prints from the 60s and 70s, and some fabric that was just plain crazy. I loved it all. The price was 'fill a bag for one dollar.' I limited myself to just one bag (because my stash runneth over).

Soon I learned that this little estate sale was run by the loved ones of the couple.

As I paid for my fabric I overheard several comments about 'Grandma's quilts,' 'Auntie's favorite tablecloth,' or 'Mom's old treadle machine.' I had come looking for a bargain and had stumbled upon a family tribute to two cherished people. This family seemed to think it quite normal for Granny to have had such a huge fabric collection. It cheered me to see an entire trunk full of unfinished sewing projects and three large boxes of dusty clothing patterns.

I didn't know the quilter who had lived at that house. That's too bad, because I know I would have liked her even more than I liked her sale.

Remember, your entry must be a quilt no larger than 120 inches around and inspired by one or more of the theme elements. Don't forget to put a sleeve and a label on the back!

The Lancaster Quilt & Textile Museum Trip Report by Susan Carty

If you are traveling back East, try and go to the new Lancaster Quilt & Textile Museum, just 80 miles west of Philadelphia, in the heart of Pennsylvania Dutch country. It just opened to the public on March 31, 2004 and features a colorful selection of Amish quilts — some more than 100 years old — collected over the past 30 years by Doug Tompkins, who founded the Esprit casual clothing company in San Francisco in the 1970s.



The quilts are beautifully displayed in glass cases with a historical note on the end of the case, and informative material about the time period from the 1880s to the 1940s, according to Peter S. Seibert, president of the Heritage Center of Lancaster County, a nonprofit group that oversees the museum. Less than half of the 82-quilt collection is currently on display in a 1912 Beaux Artsstyle building downtown, which originally housed a community bank that closed in 1933. Other pieces will be shown on a rotating basis (which means, of course, that another trip is definitely in order!).



By the way, the gift shop is tiny - but great!

Bus Trip to Pacific International Quilt Festival

Santa Barbara Air Bus has made arrangements for a 2-day bus trip to Santa Clara for the Pacific International Show on Saturday and Sunday, October 16th and 17th. The cost is \$166 for double occupancy and \$226 for a single. This price includes overnight accommodations at the Hilton, which is just across the street from the convention center, and show admission for 2 days.° The bus will leave Santa Barbara at approximately 6:00 AM on Sat. and return Sun. about 10:00 PM. A \$100 deposit is required at the time of sign-up.

This is the largest quilt show on the west coast with over 700 quilts and garments on display. The vendor mall features over 150 booths with everything from quilts, fabrics, supplies and much more.



Block Of The Month - September

September in Santa Barbara can be HOT!
So, how about a trip to the mountains?
Not to those dry, dusty mountains north of town,
but to the cool, clear air of the.....




...DELECTABLE MOUNTAINS!

Fabrics: You will need:

- 1. A Medium to Dark Brown Print
- 2. A White or Off-White solid or tone-on-tone
- Four Medium to Dark "Fall-Colored" Prints: Use any combination of Reds, Rusts, Oranges, Yellows, Golds, Greens, or Browns.


Cutting:


- 1. From Brown Print, cut one half-square triangle measuring 7" on short sides.
- 2. From White, cut one half-square triangle measuring 11" on short sides.
- 3. From White, cut three 3" squares. Draw a diagonal line on the back of each.
- 4. From White, cut one 2-1/2" square.
- 5. From "Fall Colors", cut four 3" colored squares (one each color). Cut one in half diagonally.



Assembly:

- 1. Lay three 3" white squares on three colored 3" squares, right sides together. Sew 1/4" from each side of drawn line. Cut along drawn line. Press open to make 6 triangle-squares. Trim each to 2-1/2" square.
- 2. Lay out and assemble the pieces as shown, pressing each unit before sewing to the next. Your finished block should measure 10-1/2".

Quilt Exhibitor Information

This exhibit is a **members' showcase**, providing an opportunity for everyone to display their newest, best, or favorite quilt(s) at a large show. The committee urges each and every member of the Guild to submit one or more entries to this event.

Submit your written entry(ies) as soon as possible. It's not too early to reserve your place on the wall. Your quilt(s) <u>must be completed</u> by the application deadline. Every member of Coastal Quilters Guild is assured of the display of at least one quilt. Exhibit space permitting, additional quilts will be selected according to available space. Please indicate the priority of the submitted entry; every effort will be made to honor your priority.

For purposes of this show, a **quilt** is defined as a fabric construction consisting of a front, filler layer, and back held together with stitching and made by the member-exhibitor. Cheater panels and tied quilts will not be accepted. Quilts may not have been hung at a previous CQG exhibit.

Security Arrangements: Every effort will be made to protect all quilts. Accounting and surveillance will be strictly planned and maintained. Eating and smoking are prohibited in the exhibit hall. Responsible white-gloved hostesses will try to keep all quilts in view at all times and will discourage touching by viewers. However, CQG show insurance does not cover the quilts. Each owner is responsible for insuring her own quilt(s) for loss and damage.

Sleeve: A 4" sleeve must be attached to the back top. This provides a safe and secure means of hanging the quilt. Quilts without sleeves will not be exhibited.

Label: An identifying label should be sewn securely to the quilt on the back of the lower right side stating the quilter's name, address, telephone number, and name of quilt.

Photograph: A photograph of the quilt must accompany this application. Please label the photo and staple it to the back of this form. Photos will not be returned.

Judging: If you wish your entry to be judged, you must **cover** the label with a piece of cloth or paper pinned to the quilt. A **\$5** fee for judged quilts must accompany this form.

Packaging: Each quilt must be delivered in its own pillowcase with the maker's name marked in indelible ink in large letters on the hem. This will help keep the quilt clean and facilitate transport.

Categories Here is a brief outline of the judging categories.

Traditional: a pattern or design with an established history in the quilting tradition.

Innovative: a design with fundamental deviation from traditional patterns and sets, reflecting growth through tradition.

Group: a quilt made by two or more people, excluding commercial quilting.

Pictorial: an art quilt that illustrates a recognizable image, such a people, wildlife, cityscapes, etc.





QUILT SHOW VOLUNTEER SIGN-UPS BEGIN!

At the August Guild meeting, members can sign up for Quilt Show jobs. There is a wide variety of work to be done, something to fit everyone's interest and schedule. Please participate and experience the fun and satisfaction of being an important part of the show!

Publicity: Prior to the show, at least one volunteer is needed to assist with advertising contacts and/or help distribute posters with information about the show. *Contact Penny Odom* (563-4979).

Acquisitions: About 7-10 days before the show, collectors are needed to collect an assigned number of quilts. They must bring those quilts to the judging session the Thursday before the show and take the quilts to Earl Warren on Friday to be hung. Volunteers also are needed to help re-distribute the quilts at the end of the show on Sunday afternoon. *Contact Kristin Otte* (683-4390).

Set-Up: The day before the show, volunteers are needed to set up the show, including hanging the quilts. These people must be able to climb a ladder, hold their arms up in the air, carry at least 20 lbs. (big pile of quilts), and follow instructions to the letter. *Contact Judith Nybakken* (967-0276) or Ranell Hansen (684-7042).

Take-Down: Sunday afternoon, at the close of the show, volunteers are needed to take down the show. See requirements listed for Set-Up. *Contact Judith Nybakken* (967-0276).

Admission Sales: During the show, these volunteers will sit at a table at the show entrance and sell admission wristbands. *Contact Cynthia Manzer* (687-0657). Information Table: During the show, these volunteers will sit and provide information about the Guild and answer questions. *Contact Cynthia Manzer* (687-0657). Opportunity Quilt: During the show, these volunteers will sit with the Opportunity Quilt and sell raffle tickets, as well as the Guild-logo tote bags. *Contact Wanda Livernois* (962-4247) or Lena Scharfeld (682-3639).

Featured Artist: During the show, volunteers are needed to sit in the display area and sell books. Other volunteers will be "white glovers" (see below). They will need to be familiar with Velda Newman's work. *Contact Susan West* (962-3650).

White Glove: These volunteers, wearing white gloves provided by the Guild, are the show hostesses. They will show quilt backs, answer questions and help as needed. They will be on their feet for approximately 2 hours. *Contact Cynthia Manzer* (687-0657).

Floaters: During the show, these volunteers will assist the Show Chair and Vendor Committee and fill in where needed. They may be on their feet for approximately 2 hours. *Contact Cynthia Manzer* (687-0657).

Security: During the show, these volunteers will sit at the side or back doors. *Contact Cynthia Manzer (687-0657).*

Education: During the show, these volunteers will assist visitors with the Education activity and answer questions. *Contact Oleta Bennett (964-2114).*
