

French ribbons from Elly Sienkiewicz's ribbon embroidery class, a painted muslin pear created during my day with Velda Newman, one half of the front of a jacket designed during a Rachel Clark class, some liberated house blocks a la Gwen Marston, and of course, my Peaky and Spike templates from delightful Doreen Speckman. Believe me, I could go on and on.

Perhaps I should be embarrassed about accumulating so many UFO's, but that is not the case. I learn something new in each and every workshop. Of course some classes are better than others. Some teachers are more articulate or more entertaining, and some just have a quilting style that I really like.



### Block of the Month - November

# CROCKETT CABIN

This block is named for Davy Crockett, long a symbol of the wild American Frontier. Born in 1876, in the backwoods of what is now Tennessee, Davy Crockett rose from humble beginnings to become a pioneer, patriot, soldier, trapper, explorer, state legislator, and congressman.

#### A FABRICS:

- 1) DARK or MEDIUM GREEN PRINT
- 2) WHITE or WHITE-ON-WHITE

#### FROM WHITE FABRIC, CUT:


- 2 4-1/2" squares. Draw a diagonal line on the back of each.
- 8 3-1/2" squares


#### FROM GREEN PRINT, CUT:

- 2 4-1/2" squares
- 4 3-1/2" squares


#### ASSEMBLY:


- 1. Place the 4-1/2" white squares on top of the 4-1/2" green squares, **right** sides together. Stitch 1/4" away from each side of the drawn line.
- 2. CUT along drawn line. Press pieces open to make four triangle-squares.
- 3. TRIM each triangle-square to 3-1/2".
- 4. Lay out all pieces as shown in block diagram. Sew pieces together into rows. Pin seams at matching points, then join rows to complete block. Tip: For easiest matching, press seams of adjoining rows in alternating directions. Your block should measure 12-1/2".

















# Joen Wolfrom Workshop A Celebration of Color in Fabric



Friday, November 12, 2004

9:00 am – 3:30 pm Goleta Valley Community Center 5679 Hollister Avenue, Goleta CA

This class is designed to help you become more comfortable with selecting colors and fabrics to use in your quilts. We will play with fabrics in small groups and individually. Bring a good supply of fabrics to class, so you are not too limited (do not cut them up, just bring them as they are). It is not necessary to bring your entire stash or an SUV filled to the brim! Just bring as much as you can—within reason.


#### Please bring the following:


- You will need pencil, glue stick, fabric scissors, and/or rotary cutter and mat; several sheets of large drawing paper (plain white paper), and colored pencils.
- Bring a great amount of fabrics from your favorite color families (1/4 1 yd pieces):
  - o Bring fabrics you love and enjoy using
  - o Bring fabrics with a range of values (light to dark)
  - o Bring fabrics with the four color scales (pure color, tints, shades, tones)
  - o Bring a fabric range with varying color intensities (intense, pure, brilliant colors; slightly grayed colors; and very grayed, dull colors)
  - o Bring fabrics with a wide variety of textures and designs
- You don't need to bring your entire fabric collection, but bring enough so that you have great options for putting fabrics together to create a quilt.
- Bring a pattern or design that you want to use in an upcoming quilt. One of your class exercises
  will be to select fabrics for this quilt project. Fabrics for this project may be incorporated from
  your own fabric collection and/or from your favorite quilt store's current available fabric
  selection.
- If you have the *3-in-1 Color Tool* (by Joen Wolfrom, C & T Publishing) or can borrow one, please bring it to class, as it is to your advantage to have this tool handy for a color reference for our exercises. You may use the book, *Color Play*, as a substitute for this tool, if you wish.




If possible, please read *Color Play*, particularly Chapters 1 & 2. Also read the chapters that include your favorite colors.




