Take the time and read their stories. If the quilter is around ask her/him to describe their journey.

## October Speaker & Workshop





Kim Fauth has designed a process for making interchangeable quilt blocks called the ABCD Quilting Process. For our October meeting she will share some of the many quilts she has made using this process. The workshop the next day will consist of learning how to make the 32 blocks and fit them together in an infinite number ways to make a wonderful quilt. No paper piecing, special rulers or templates are required. A book will be available, but not necessary for the workshop.

Community Quilts is now focused on making the doll cradle quilts and bedding sets for Unity Shoppe. The wood shop folks increased the number of doll cradles this year to 175 wooden cradles, which are now being painted by local artists. The Unity Shoppe depends on the Guild to create the bedding for these lovingly hand-crafted and hand-painted cradles. We are about halfway there, with about 80 finished sets. We gave out 50 kits at the August meeting. If every kit is finished and turned in, we'll have 130 sets, leaving us just 45 short of our goal. So I urge you to please complete your kit if you took one and then come get another one at the September meeting. What good is a doll bed without bedding?

Instructions can be downloaded from our website. They take only a few hours to complete, and truly, the second one is even easier than the first, and they get even quicker and easier after that.

We are, of course, still accepting quilts for CALM, veterans and Hospice. We are about 20 quilts short of the 100 that CALM requested, and the need for veterans' and Hospice quilts is on-going. We are also just two lap-size quilts short of making a delivery to Sarah House. Look on our website for more information about all these organizations that are so worthy of our time and effort.

## Quilt Show Timetable & Information for Quilt Entries

**Aug. 29** Collectors begin contacting members to arrange for quilt collection

**Sept. 8** Final day for quilt collection

**Sept. 12** Judging Day

**Information & Reminders for Quilt Show Entrants** 

So you've entered your quilt and you're looking forward to exhibiting at the quilt show. Congratulations! Around the end of August, you should be hearing from the Collector, to whom you will deliver your quilt at a mutually agreed-upon place, day and time. *About* the Collectors: Unless you have already made arrangements with me, please work with the Collector assigned to you. When all the guilts come into Earl Warren on the day before the show, they are checked in on either the "Judged Quilts" checklist or a separate "Non-judged" checklist for each Collector. It is a hectic time and not one where we want to take time to hunt down a guilt that's on a list but doesn't arrive with the others. We know these guilts are your babies. Please help us keep them safe and expedite the check-in and check-out process.

To make this process go smoothly and help insure the security of your quilt, please remember to do the

following to prepare it for entry into the show: (Unless you have indicated on your entry form that your quilt needs special handling and/or must be submitted in a different way.)

- 1. Attach a 4" hanging sleeve to the back top of the quilt. If the quilt is more than 80" long, please adjust the sleeve (or add a second sleeve) at 80"...
- 2. Please sew an identification label to the back in a lower corner of the quilt, stating at minimum the Quilter's Name and Quilt Title. If your quilt is being judged, cover this label by lightly basting a piece of cloth over the identification label. This will be removed by the Judging Committee before the quilt is hung at the show.
- 3. Please fold or roll your quilt and put it into a cloth bag or pillowcase. Safety-pin it closed and mark the top with your name and phone number using indelible ink. (Special Handling entries must include the same identification information on the outside of whatever container they're in.)

Even if your quilt is not being judged, please make every effort to remove loose threads, pet hair, and anything else that might negatively affect the appearance of your quilt. You would be surprised how many comments we receive from our quilt show judges about these unwanted "cling-ons."


# Block of the Month Is a Bountiful Harvest

It's the month of witches, goblins and ghouls.

Dress up this block with black and orange. Use some Halloween prints, if you have them.

#### **Cutting:**

White or white on white print or white tiny Halloween print.

Cut one 7-1/4" square.

Cut 4 (3-1/2") squares.

Orange:

Cut 4 (3-1/2") squares.

Black:

Cut one 7-1/4" square.

Assembly

1. Draw a line corner to corner on the 7-1/4" white square. This is the cutting line.

Draw a line 1/4" from the cutting line and on each side of the cutting line. These are the sewing lines.

Pin white square and the 7-1/4" black square right sides together. Stitch on the two sewing lines.

Cut on the cutting line. Press seam to the black

Cut on the cutting line. Press seam to the black.
Trim units to 6-1/2". A good tool to use is the Block Loc ruler.

















- 2. Sew the 3-1/2" white and orange squares together. Press to orange. Join units to make 2 four patch units
- Join units to make 2 four patch units.

  3. Join the triangle units with the 4 patch units to make the Northern Star block. Press to 4 patch units. Block should measure 12-1/2".
