January Speaker/Workshop: Linda Schmidt

2018. . . HERE WE GO!

To start the New Year off, we welcome our speaker for January, **Linda Schmidt** from Dublin, California. The busy holiday season, plus stress and anxiety about our fires and mandatory evacuations, might have taken a toll on our concentration and left us with a very short attention span for sure! So, it seems very fortuitous that Linda will be talking about “**Short Attention Span Quilting.**” She will share her development as an eclectic art quilter, starting with her Grandma’s quilt and moving through her story of portrait, landscape, abstract and liturgical quilts.

Linda comes from a long line of quilting women and has been sewing and quilting since she was eight years old. She teaches quilting nationally and internationally. In April 2003, Linda was named “Quilting Teacher of the Year” by *Professional Quilter Magazine*. She does trunk shows, judges quilt shows and was a member of the Alameda County Art Commission. She has been awarded over 300 ribbons for quilts and garments, including First Place, Best in Class, Best of Show, Viewer’s Choice & Judge’s Choice in quilt shows and art shows. As a Featured Artist at the Empty Spools Conference at Asilomar, she has been a “special” lecturer and taught many classes. Her articles and work have appeared in *McCall’s Quilting*, *Quilter’s Newsletter*, and *Quilter’s Quarterly*.



Linda will also conduct the workshop “**Life’s a Beach**” on January 12, 2018. In this easy, fun workshop, you will create a sandy beach complete with rocks and water. In the process, you will play with Puff Paint, sheer melted fabrics, fabric paints and much more fun stuff! Helping California Fire Victims: Check websites listed below for more info:

SANTA ROSA FIRE: Norah McMeeking is collecting fat quarters (or more generous cuts) which she will deliver in January. Bring donations to the January meeting or contact Norah (norah@cox.net).

THOMAS FIRE:

Superbuzzy, a Ventura fabric store – definitely worth a visit – is collecting fabric, quilts and blocks for Thomas Fire relief. Check superbuzzy.com for details about these needs:

- **Bed-size quilts:** Donate completed bed-sized quilts, any design.
- **Quilt tops:** Superbuzzy will finish and distribute.

Quilt Blocks: with donations of the [Perkiomen Valley Block](#), the [Ventura Modern Quilt Guild](#) will assemble quilts—or you can donate a finished quilt with 42 PV blocks.

Pre-Cut Fabric: Donate 5" or 10" pre-cut packs or squares of quilt shop-quality fabric (your own, or purchased thru superbuzzy.com for Thomas Fire relief quilts).

- **Quilt Backing:** Donate quilt shop-quality fabrics (4 yards or more), especially 108" wides.
- **Batting:** Donate bed-sized batting to help complete quilts.
- **Thread:** Donate good quality, new cotton thread, 40 or 50 weight.

Pillowcases: Donate standard size pillowcases for children and adults. [The Roll It Up pattern and tutorial](#) is quick and fun to make.

Sewing & Quilting Help: If you'd like to help complete Thomas Fire quilts, please [let Superbuzzy know](#). They'll get in touch later, when sew-ins are scheduled.

Here are the submission guidelines:

A song from your high school years—Must represent the **title of one song** (any genre – rock 'n roll; ballad; theme from TV, musical, or movie, etc.)

Must be a quilt only – no dolls, aprons, vests, bags, etc.

Debut quilts only – not previously exhibited

Any shape – **maximum perimeter is 96"**

One entry only per person

Add a sleeve (2"- 4") and a covered label

To be finished and submitted in March

To be submitted in a labeled pillowcase with entry form

Exhibit and voting will be at the April Guild meeting

These entries will fit nicely with the "Memories" theme of the next quilt show in September 2018, so please plan on showing your entry then.



Rosebud

12" Finished Block

Block of the Month



Cutting

Cream print:

Cut six 2-7/8" squares. Cut diagonally once.
Cut two 6-7/8" squares. Cut diagonally once.

Light green:


Cut two 4-7/8" squares. Cut diagonally once.

Red (or pink):

Cut four 2-7/8" squares. Cut diagonally once.

Assembly


1. Sew small cream and red triangles together, as shown below. Note pressing arrows.
Add green triangles, to make the rosebud units. Press seams to green triangles.



2. Add large cream triangles. Press seams to cream triangles. Make four units.



3. Arrange units to make the Rosebud block.
Sew into rows. Press seams toward light triangle. Sew rows together.
Block should measure 12-1/2".
