

HOC: Quilt Show Entry Instructions

- 1. Thursday, August 9 is the firm deadline for Entry and Judging Forms. Printed forms can be turned in at the Guild meeting or mailed to arrive on August 9 (Heather Georgakis, 5347 University Dr., Santa Barbara, CA 93111.) (Forms with photos must turned in or delivered; separate photos are needed for Entry and Judging.)
- 2. Links to Instructions, Entry Guidelines, Entry Form and Judging Form are on the website under "Quilt Show" (www.coastalquilters.org/).
- 3. For important details, get the Quilt Show Entry Guidelines here or at the meeting.
- 4. We hope you'll use the online process, but traditional paper forms can be downloaded with these links: Paper Judging Form.
- 5. To use our new online entry process:
 - a. For each quilt you are eligible to enter, submit an <u>online Entry Form</u> (click on the link) <u>then</u> print, complete and deliver a 2018 Photo Attachment to Entry Form with a 4 x 6 color photo of your quilt.
 - b. For each quilt you are eligible to have judged, <u>In addition</u> to the online Entry Form and Photo Attachment, submit an <u>online Judging Form</u> (click on the link) <u>then</u> print, complete and deliver a <u>2018 Photo</u> Attachment to Judging Form with a 4 x 6 color photo and \$15 judging fee.

HOC: Judged Quilt Categories

To enter a judged quilt using our "online" process:

- 1. Fill out an online Entry form.
- 2. Fill out an online Judging Form.
- 3. Print out and complete an Entry form Photo Attachment (needs photo).
- 4. Print out and complete an Judging Form Photo Attachment (needs photo).

If you choose to use our "paper" process, please print out and complete two forms (Entry and Judging) and attach a photo to each form.

You may submit up to two quilts for judging. On your Judging Form, you will need to check a judging category from one of these:

Traditional: A pattern or design with an established history in the quilting tradition. This includes block-based, medallion, crazy, whole cloth quilts, appliqué and mixed appliqué.

Modern: Quilts that are functional, clean lined, or graphic. May have bold colors and prints, solid colors, or asymmetry with expansive negative space inspired by modern design. Alternate grid work is often part of the composition, modifying the block arrangement and /or the scale.

Art: Includes abstract or representational subject such as nature-scape, people, pictorial, or whimsical. Is an original design and exploration rather than the handing down of a "pattern." It may be experiment with self-expression as primary process. (Note: The art style quilts may be divided into Original and Pattern Based categories to allow judging of the craftsmanship of quilts made from commercial patterns).

Innovative/Contemporary: Usually pieced quilts with fundamental deviation from traditional patterns and sets. Should reflect growth through tradition. based on traction alone designs and then move beyond the traditional implementation to create a contemporary quilt.

Explanation of Some Key Terms:

Representational - recognizable or identifiable subject

Abstract - art that does not attempt to represent external recognizable reality; relies on line, form, and color to create design; uses personal expression and originality in concept, design and execution.

Any questions, please let us know. We will do our best to keep you in the category that you prefer. Sometimes we need to change a quilt to another category to keep the categories cohesive. If this happens, we will let you know.



SCRAP INSANITY: LOG CABIN

12" Block (12.5" Unfinished)





September 2018 Coastal Quilters Guild Block of the Month

This is a very simple version of the Log Cabin block using scraps from your stash. There are 16 squares and strips with several wonderful secondary patterns. Click this <u>August 2010 BoM</u> newsletter link to see photos of the patterns that can be formed with these blocks.

Fabric:

<u>Background:</u> White and/or Cream. You will need 5 different fabrics Scraps: You will need 5 different medium and dark print fabrics.

Black: Please use solid black or black tone-on-tone fabrics. Not black and white.

Cutting:

Cut 2 ½" strips into the following lengths:

10 ½" - 1 Background and 1 Scrap 8 ½ - 1 Background and 1 Scrap

4 ½ " - 1 Background and 1 Scrap

2 ½ " - 1 Background and 1 Scrap

2 ½ " square – 6 Black

Assembly:

Sew the rows together one at a time, as follows:

Ba	ckground	Black	Scrap
Row 1:	10 ½ "	2 ½ "	
Row 2:	8 1/2"	2 1/2"	2 1/2"
Row 3:	8 1/2"	2 ½"	4 1/2"
Row 4:	4 1/2"	2 ½'	6 ½"
Row 5:	2 ½"	2 1/2"	8 1/2"
Row 6:		2 1/2"	10 ½"

Sew assembled rows together horizontally as shown in the picture.
