October Speaker: Irele Beatie

"From 80's Hand Applique to Today's Modern Aesthetic"

You know Irele as our past president as well as past and current quilt show chair. She is a prolific quilter making quilts for family and friends and donating many of her quilts to charity. Irele's lecture and trunk show will take you through her journey as a quilter from hand applique in the 80's to a more modern aesthetic today. Many of the quilts in her trunk show reflect the workshops she has taken, and many quilts are her original designs.



Workshop October 12: Not So Twin Strips

Irele will teach a workshop based on her pattern, *Not So Twin Strips*, a simple strip-pieced process in which fabric selection is key to achieving the design you desire. With fabric choices and placement, you can achieve a plaid look or create an interesting neutral background for applique. Fee for members is \$40. Required pattern is \$10, payable to instructor. Good news! The new 2018-2019 directory will be available at the October meeting. Please pick yours up at the Membership table when you sign in.



ROAD TO CALIFORNIA WANTS YOUR QUILT

Our Guild has been asked to display quilts in the ATRIUM EXHIBIT
at the ROAD TO CALIFORNIA — January 24-27, 2019

Quilts may be any style and color. The exhibit is designed to showcase the work of our Guild members. It is not a competition and the quilts are not judged. They are looking for quilts that are made by the average quilter and not for any one style or category of quilts. A diversity of quilts and quilt makers creates a very interesting exhibit that draws the attention of all quilters. Requirements:

1. Quilts must be at the minimum 72" long.
2. Quilts must be no wider than 100".
3. Only one quilt per member.
4. We will need an electronic picture (i.e jpg).
5. It must have a 4" continuous sleeve.
6. It is OK if in a previous quilt show but not necessary.



WE THINK THIS IS VERY EXCITING BUT we are only allowed to display 44 quilts so we are going to have a lottery at the October meeting. If you have a quilt that meets the above requirements, send an email to or call: Darilyn Kisch, dkisch@cox.net, 1-805-689-1480 no later than Wednesday, October 10, saying you want your quilt included, the name of the quilt, and its measurements. We will put your name in the bucket and hope that yours is picked. Additional information will be provided when we contact the *winners*.

Call for Quilts for Carr Fire Victims

The California community of Redding was devastated by the Carr Fire, with 1,029 homes destroyed. The Southern California Council of Quilt Guilds received a request for **new quilts** from the Quilters Sew-ciety of Redding, Inc. They hope to give a new quilt to every victim who lost their home.

1. New quilts can be lap-sized and larger for kids or adults.
2. Donations of supplies are also being collected for the Quilters Sew-ciety to make new quilts, and they need quilt shop fabric, new thread, and batting (Warm and Natural, Quilter's Dream, Hobbs).



SCRAP INSANITY: SPOOLS

12" Block (12.5" Unfinished)

November 2018

Coastal Quilters Guild Block of the Month



"Have you ever been in the middle of a project and run out of thread? These pretty spools won't really help with that problem, but they will be fun to make."

Thanks to Darilyn, Cathe and Kathy, our awesome BoM chairs from Nov 2010.

Fabric

Spools: 4 different Brown or Tan fabrics

Cut 8 pieces, $6\frac{1}{2}$ " x 2" rectangles (4 sets of 2 matched pairs)

Thread: 4 different fabrics (stripes work very well)

Cut 4 pieces, $3\frac{1}{2}$ " square

Background: White or Cream

Cut 8 pieces $3\frac{1}{2}$ " x 2"

Cut 16 pieces 2" square

Assembly

To make the spool ends:

- Mark a diagonal line from corner to corner on the back side of the 2" background piece.
- Place piece right sides together, on each end of the spool fabric lining up the edges of the fabric.
- Stitch on the diagonal line toward center of spool end. Trim seam to $\frac{1}{4}$ ".
- Make two identical spool ends for each quarter of the block.

For the thread component:

- Sew a $3\frac{1}{2}$ " x 2" piece of background fabric to opposite sides of the thread fabric.

Make four $6\frac{1}{4}$ " spool blocks. Assembling each block in rows with a spool end, thread and a spool end, making sure the spool ends line up correctly with the thread fabric. Use the diagram as your guide.
