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September Speaker: Jennifer Sampou, "How to Harness Your MOJO: Golden Creativity"

Jennifer Sampou began her career at New York's Fashion Institute of Technology, then went on to study textiles at the Univ. of Vermont. After working as a designer for Laura Ashley, she joined P&B Textiles as creative director, then opened her own company, Studio Sampou, creating timeless fabrics for Robert Kaufman. A longtime traveler, she finds inspiration from the beauty she encounters along the way. For her presentation, she'll talk about nourishing our creativity — the elements that feed it, what can distract, and how to keep our mojo going.



September Workshop: Jennifer Sampou, "Octagon Shimmer"



Take a time-honored quilt design, blow it up, then add a healthy dose of contemporary color sensibility with some improv thrown in for good measure... that's Jennifer Sampou's "Octagon Shimmer" quilt, beautifully spanning both traditional and modern. Her classes at Craft Napa and elsewhere regularly sell out; we're fortunate she's able to join us for September. Some people have expressed concern about the supply fee. Please note this includes templates and the pattern. If you already have the pattern, email Jennifer for the adjusted fee. Also, she is available for consultation prior to our workshop to help you with fabric choices. (Check her supply list for contact info.) The workshop will include a lot of play with color, composition, scale, and value along with other elements.

La Vie de Bohème Finlayson Gallery

July 21 - October 13

La Vie de Bohème celebrates the collaboration between two San Jose cultural institutions, San Jose Museum of Quilts & Textiles and Opera San José. Showcasing costumes, illustrations and props from Opera San José's production of La Bohème, the costumes illuminate the story of a group of bohemians, and how their lives become intertwined. Although the novel was set in Paris in the 1840s, the costumes in this exhibition represent the 1920s.

Mayan Traje: a Tradition in Transition Turner and Gillilang Galleries

July 21 - October 13

The Maya of Guatemala are known worldwide for their excellent weaving and distinctive trajes (traditional clothing). These were once 100% village-specific, and people could be recognized as being from a specific place. Over time, many and diverse influences have caused significant change - but even so, visitors are struck by the ubiquitous nature of

indigenous weaving and the persistence of their "wearable art". This exhibit will show outstanding examples of clothing from the early 20th century to contemporary fashion, highlight key differences, and explore some of the reasons for these changes. On view will be individual pieces as well as full trajes – none created for tourist markets. These will be drawn from the rarely-displayed collection of the Friends of the Ixchel Museum.


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Block of the Month for September 2019

Tam's Patch

12 x 12" Block (12.5 x 12.5" Unfinished)





This year we will be making quick and easy blocks. Members new to the Guild can brush up on techniques and learn ones that may be new to them. All blocks finish 12" square. The goal is that you will make a block each month to include in the Block of the Month drawing. You can also make your own 12 block sampler quilt. See the sampler quilt instructions for a supply list. Each month make one block for your personal quilt, then refer to the <u>sampler quilt instructions to set your 12 blocks</u> in one of three ways: on point, set square or framed.

Have fun piecing!

Fabric and Cutting

For this block, choose primary colors - Red, Yellow and Blue. You can use children's prints or other prints that read as those colors if you like them.

Red Fabric:

Cut 2 - 3 1/2" Squares

• Yellow Fabric:

Cut 2 - 3 1/2" Squares

Cut 2 - 3 1/2" x 6 1/2" Rectangles

• Blue Fabric:

Cut 2 - 6 1/2" Squares

Assembly

Use 1/4" seam allowances.

- **1.** Sew 3 1/2" Yellow squares to 3 1/2" Red squares. Press toward Red.
- **2.** Sew 3 1/2" x 6 1/2" Yellow rectangles to units from step 1. Press toward Yellow rectangle. Unit should measure 6 1/2" square.
- **3.** Join Yellow/Red units to Blue squares as shown. Press toward blue squares.
- **4.** Join the two rectangular units from step 3 to form the block.
