# September Speaker: Jennifer Sampou, "How to Harness Your MOJO: Golden Creativity"

We are delighted to have renowned quilt artist and fabric designer Jennifer Sampou speak at our Guild for the September meeting. Over the past 30 years, she's combined an academic background in textiles (Fashion Institute of Technology, Univ. of Vermont) with a career as creative director for P&B Textiles before opening



her own company, Studio Sampou, in 1996. Now she creates beautiful quilts that feature lots of play with color and shape along with her timeless fabrics. Her talk will be about a subject she knows well: nourishing our creativity — the elements that feed it, what can distract, and how to keep our mojo going.



# September Workshop: Jennifer Sampou, "Octagon Shimmer"

I first saw Jennifer Sampou's "Octagon Shimmer" quilt at QuiltCon where it stood out from across the room: traditional in design, but completely modern in scale and color sensibility. We'll get a running start on our own versions of the quilt, with encouragement and instruction from Jennifer on color, composition, scale, value, and a bit of improv. ### October Speaker: Linda Ballard, "Discover Possibilities"

Popular quilting teacher Linda Ballard says, "People ask me what I look for when I'm writing a new quilt pattern. How do I know what components to make? Can I make it easier than what my eye sees? This program will show you how I look at quilts, what I can do to simplify the construction, and what techniques I can share with my



quilters. The audience is encouraged to participate throughout the program while I'm sharing quilts both on screen and in person. When you see what I have to share, you'll see why people think some of my quilts are hard when, in fact, they're pretty darn easy." Come prepared to Discover the Possibilities!

# Sewjourners — a satellite group of the Coastal Quilters Guild

At a general meeting many years ago, a member spoke to the Guild about starting a new art quilt satellite group. She asked interested members to join her at the break to discuss the possibility. The Sewjourners have been going strong ever since. Some of our nine current members were a part of that original group.

We meet once a month, and our focus is on the improvement of our design and composition skills. Approximately once a year we select a book, artist, or other medium to study and use as a guide for our growth. Sharing our work and working toward continuous progress through critique and demonstration keep us learning and growing. The group has become much more, in that we see each other as support for our practice and for each other.

In spring of 2017 we presented an art quilt show at the Arts Fund Gallery of Santa Barbara. Called "Sticks and Stones," it was the result of a study we had done, creating work on that topic from fiber.

Saturday, September 21, 5-7 pm, we'll have the opening reception of our new show at the Conejo Valley Art Museum, 197 N. Moorpark Rd., Thousand Oaks, CA. The new show is called "Sewjourners — Our Journey" and features a mix of projects including a black and white challenge, a one-color challenge, and more. Most often mentioned is how the support, critique, and challenges have encouraged us to expand our creative horizons and go beyond what we ever realized we could do. 

La Vie de Bohème celebrates the collaboration between two San Jose cultural institutions, San Jose Museum of Quilts & Textiles and Opera San José. Showcasing costumes, illustrations and props. The costumes illuminate the story of a group of bohemians, and how their lives become intertwined.

#### Mayan Traje: a Tradition in Transition

July 21 - October 13

The Maya of Guatemala are known worldwide for their excellent weaving and distinctive trajes (traditional clothing). These were once 100% village-specific, and people could be recognized as being from a specific place. Over time, many and diverse influences have caused significant change - but even so, visitors are struck by the ubiquitous nature of indigenous weaving and the persistence of their "wearable art". This exhibit will show outstanding examples of clothing from the early 20th century to contemporary fashion, highlight key differences, and explore some of the reasons for these changes. On view will be individual pieces as well as full trajes – none created for tourist markets. These will be drawn from the rarely-displayed collection of the Friends of the Ixchel Museum.

### **Block of the Month for October 2019**

#### **Northern Star**

12 x 12" Block (12.5 x 12.5" Unfinished)







It's the month of witches, goblins, ghouls. Dress up this block with black and orange. Use some Halloween prints, if you have them. Have fun piecing!

#### **Cutting**

- White or white on white print or white on tiny Halloween print:
  - Cut 1 7 1/4" Square
  - Cut 4 3 1/2" Square
- Orange:
  - Cut 4 3 1/2" Square
- Black:
  - Cut 1 7 1/4" Square

#### **Assembly**

Use 1/4" seam allowances.

1. Draw a line corner to corner on the 7 1/4" white square. This is the cutting line. Draw a line 1/4" from the cutting line and on each side of the cutting line. These are the sewing lines. Pin white square and the 7 1/4" black square right sides together. Stitch on the two sewing lines. Cut on the cutting line. Press sew to the black. Trim units to 6 1/2". A good tool to use is the Block Loc ruler.













- **2.** Sew the 3 1/2" white and orange squares together. Press to orange. Join units to make 2 four patch units.
- **3.** Join the triangle units with the 4 patch units to make the Northern Star block. Press to 4 patch units. Block should measure 12 1/2".
